## DISTRICT GOVERNOR MESSAGE

Fellow Lions:

This past 2 month has brought me much pleasure and honor as your District Governor. Thank you for inviting me to install your officers, as well as inducting new members into your club. Special congratulations go to SF Fil-Am and SF Chinatown Lions Club for bringing in 11 verified members and 5 verified members respectively in just two months. Lions, the District is proud of you and keep up the good work in asking and bringing in members for your club.

For the first 2 two months of my term, I have been very busy with my Team having visited 26 clubs in the District. My intention is to present my goals and objectives to your Club at the earliest possible time so you can plan and work with them from the start, especially in areas of Affiliate and Cyber Membership. After I have visited all the Clubs, I will start the visiting program again and with the focus on how to better serve your club's needs and on membership.

Aug 22nd was our 1st Cabinet meeting with two presentations by the Eye Screeners. It was a great turn out with over 142 attended. Thank you for your support and dedication. My invited guest was DG Phyllis Rogers & Lion Charlie from C2. They really enjoyed our meeting and recognized the important role of Cyber and Affiliate Memberships and invited Lion Michael to their district to make a presentation at their Cabinet meeting in Feb, 2016.

I am extremely happy to report that our District 4C4, of USA will twin with District 385, Beijing of China and District 201, Queensland of Australia. I would like to thank PP Cindy Zheng for her contribution in the Twinning with China. We have worked hard on this since the beginning of the year to lay down all the ground work and process with LCI. This is the first within MD4 to do a District to District Twinning. The Cabinet Officers voted unanimously to approve these Twinning, but waiting Australia District to approve on their side and China has already approved theirs. Paper work is being generated to complete these 2 milestones. I expect many District Twinning will follow, like with the Philippines, Taiwan, etc. It is my intent to motivate and promote International programs so Lions from across the oceans can serve together for the needs around the World. It will be exciting, rewarding, and challenging.

Our LCI matching grant for the Eye Screeners has been received. We are in the final stage to purchase them. Thanks to the Vision Committee, both vendors gave their presentation with a hands-on session at the cabinet meeting. I want to thank IPDG Jack and his team for applying for the LCI grant.

Our District GMT/GLT Team & Trainers led by PDG Mel Philips and PCC Emil Kantola will have our 1st training session on Sept 29th, 2015. It will be held at Parkside School in San Bruno. Please encourage all membership to come and sign up early.

I have invited both Lion Ronny Martin (Club Development Specialist) and PDG Paul Baker (Campus Club

Specialist) to come to the Bay Area to assist us in membership. They will be here in September. Please note that on Sept 24, 5pm to 8 pm. PDG Paul Baker will host a work shop for 3 hours on starting of a Campus Club and recruiting in general. Location has yet to be determined. All members are welcome to join us. The date for our open table recruitment at Stanford University Campus Club will be on Sept 25, 1pm to 4pm.

Congratulation to our IPDG Jack Van Etten, GMT PCC Emil, Guiding Lions Sandy Ige and IPDG Jack Van Etten in chartering of a new club called - Peninsula First Responder Lions Club. They had spent a lot effort to make this happen.

Retaining new members for the long haul is equally important as recruiting new ones. Our Mentorship Program has helped new and experienced members get another opportunity to

find more direction, meaning, and fulfillment in being a Lion. This is a great way for a new member to become the best Lion he can be by learning about the responsibilities of a Lion from an experienced mentor. Concurrently, our Lion mentors are given the opportunity to expand their knowledge, commitment, and leadership skills by participating in this program.

Increased membership and sustaining our club's growth and success mean continuously developing future leaders who can successfully take us from being "Good to Great". Member and leadership development programs abound in Lions Club - district, and even international levels. ### 2nd Vice District Governor Message

Hello, again, fellow Lions!

DG Macy, VDG Rod and I are continuing to

make our way around to the clubs of our District. It is wonderful to see the great work being done in our communities by the many volunteers that make up our Lions family.

The common theme that we hear in our travels around 4-C4 is the challenge of attracting and keeping new members. While I am certainly not an authority on the subject of recruiting, here are some thoughts for your consideration:

- 1) Don't be embarrassed to invite people to join. We are not selling anything. When we recruit new prospects, we are not trying to separate them from their money. We are giving them the opportunity to serve. Everyone deserves the chance to make their world better. Help them to make a difference.
- 2) Don't be afraid of rejection: a "No" today may be a "yes" tomorrow. Plant a seed.

3) We join for various reasons: for social reasons: we were invited by a friend; for business reasons: we want to create networks within the community in which we live; for philanthropic reasons: we want to give back to the community.

4) Think about what you love about your club and emphasize that aspect. I love being a member of the San Bruno Lions Club. We have a great time at every meeting and we do some pretty amazing projects. What do you love about your club?

5) Think about who would fit into the culture of your club. If you don't think that they would be a good fit with your club, you might consider referring them to another club. Take the extra step of making the initial contact to the other club's membership chair. You never know, the favor may be returned someday.

6) Recruitment is not the responsibility of only one person in the club. It is everyone's responsibility. The membership chair and the president may take the lead but everyone needs to be inviting their friends and colleagues. Consider having invite-a-guest nights.

7) A membership committee should be formed. Use the Just Ask! membership recruitment guide available from LCI (on the LCI website or contact me). Use the strategies suggested. It takes a team to plan and implement successful club growth. Set achievable goals and a reasonable time schedule.

8) Keep the meetings interesting and fun. Going to a meeting should be something that members look forward to; it shouldn't be a chore or drudgery. The tail twister and program chair play key roles in this regard.

9) If you know that someone is planning to leave a club possibly due to a change in hours or interests, you might suggest a transfer to another club. (Obviously, you do what you can to keep the member in your club.)

10) Involve your new members quickly in the club's projects. The sooner you do this, the quicker it becomes "their club".

I welcome your comments. I know I've missed many good ideas. Let's have a dialogue.

### District Web Site FAQ

The **top goal** with the redesign of the web site is to keep **an uncluttered view of content**. Our goal is to keep as much of the content that Lion Alison Wilson had on the old site and add new content as applicable, but to do so with an uncluttered view. To achieve this purpose, we have web pages dedicated to given topics with accordions, tabs, and sliders to organize the content. An *Accordion* is a tab that opens and closes by clicking it, but stays closed. A *Tab* is always open but only the active tab

will show content when more there's more than 1 tab. *Sliders* are the cool photo slides you see on the pages. The slides can be stationary or changing. The pictures can be links.

Our programming language, WordPress, allows us to use plugins & widgets to further organize and display content. For example, we are using the Feed Me Social plugin to display our Facebook Group Page feed on our Social Media page. I can put that in a Tab or an Accordion to further keep an uncluttered view.

Our site is in beta mode, so it is subject to change in the way it looks as we play around with plugins and tools to find the best way to display our content. As District webmaster, it is mainly Lion John Gill who will update the site, but the advisors & co-chairs are available to help when needed.
