

Go Bag for Emergencies ... By: Newsletter Editor

Per DG Lion Clayton's focus on Disaster Preparedness, we'll be sharing charities and disaster preparedness resources for this series. With all the wildfires happening in California this summer, our first article will feature what supplies to put into our GO Bag— Emergency supplies kit to have ready to go in case of an emergency that requires evacuation. FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, recommends assembling a kit of basic supplies that can last at least 72 hours in the event of a disaster. The kit should include:

- Bottled water and nonperishable food, such a s granola bars
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, wet wipes, etc)
- Flashlight, hand-crank or battery-operated AM/FM radio, and extra batteries
- Portable cell phone charger
- Notepad, pen/pencil, and marker
- Local street maps (paper version)
- Spare home/vehicle keys
- Whistle or bell * First aid kit * Work gloves
- Dust mask to reduce inhalation of dust and other debris
- A change of clothing (long sleeve shirt/pants, rain gear, sturdy footwear, etc.)
- Copies of important documents (insurance/medical cards, contact lists, identification, marriage and birth certificates, etc.) in a portable, waterproof container or plastic bag
- Back-up medical/assistive equipment and supplies
- A list of the medications you take, why you take them, and the dosages
- Cash, in small bills
- Supplies for your service animal or pet






