
# FROM THE 1st VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Fellow Lions

For the past two months I have been busy with DG Jack visiting majority of the clubs. Again, as a reminder, my key responsibility as 1VDG is to focus and promote membership together with our District GMT/GLT Team. I have to take this responsibility even more serious after coming back from the Council of Governor's meeting at Fairfield today. Membership in the U.S. has declined even though our District 4C4 is keeping up and remains positive. At the COG meeting, International Director Larry Dicus reported that our membership has declined to only about 30% of the total Lion population around the world. As a result the number of International Directors from the U.S. has dropped by 3 and now at 11. This is a very serious matter; and I pledge my dedication and with my best ability to help Clubs in our District to grow and retain our Lions. I need you support as we must work together as a team to keep our membership up.

At each of our visits I passed out two brochures to the club membership chair. One brochure is called "Just Ask!" and the other one is "Membership Satisfaction Guide". Just Ask! is designed to guide your club through the process of recruiting new members and effectively managing club growth. The strength of your membership and the health of your club will determine your ability to do what all Lions love to do – To Serve. So keep in mind that more members mean more service.

Although the concept is simple – Just



Just Ask! is a brochure which will lead your club through a four-step process for recruiting new members:---

- 1. Preparing your club
- 2. Creating your club's growth plan
- 3. Implementing your club's growth plan
- 4. Welcoming your new members.

The other brochure is a membership Satisfaction Guide. It helps your club know how to keep members happy and coming back. I hope each club will take time to go over these brochures at one of your meetings. In addition, I also dropped off 2 membership applications because our DG Jack wants us to recruit 2 more members from each club.

All of our DG teams just came back from our Fall COG meeting at Fairfield. I have to take an extra day for my training. I am learning every day alongside with the groups of Lions and we share our thoughts, especially on how to recruit members to grow our District. It is always a very challenging task but I am willing to do my share; will you do yours?

Thanks to all of you who attended the Photoscreening presentations on Oct 9th by PlusOptix (CEO Cyd) and PediaVison (given by PID Bill I.) and showed your interest and support for the eye screening programs for our children. In addition, thanks to those Lions who spent time to do more research and review of articles comparing the two equipment options. We are still working on getting the survey answers to all of you. Remember screening is the easy part. We also must work on a complete program to

provide eye glasses to those children who need them. There are various programs to provide further eye examinations and to give them eye glasses but a more detailed close-loop follow-up program must be established to monitor our last mile delivery of these eye glasses. In the coming months, I will work with the District vision care committee to outline and provide a more effective roadmap to this end.



At this past COG meeting, I proposed to the MD4 Council of Governors that our District host the Council of Governor's meeting in the Fall, 2015. This was judged to be a bold move as the costs of doing so in the S.F. Bay Area are typically high. However, though personal connections and relationships, I was able to bring down the costs and the COG has approved my proposal. IPDG Steve Picchi will be the chair of the event and we hope you will be able to participate and learn about how the COG works to support the 15 Districts in California.

Membership Growth Awards honor Lions and clubs that invite new members in the months of October and April. Lions that sponsor a member in October receive the Silver Membership Growth Award Pin. Lions that sponsor a member in October and April will receive both the Silver and Gold Membership Growth Award Pin. Clubs that add new members in both Octo-

ber and April will receive the Membership Growth Award Banner Patch and a

fiscal year patch. Thereafter, repeat award recipients receive a fiscal year patch to affix below the banner patch. To be eligible to receive the awards, new member and sponsor names must be reported to International Headquarters using MyLCI between October 1 and midnight October 31, and/or between April 1 and midnight April 30, Central Standard Time. Paper MMR's must be received between the 1st and
