





Lions Summer School

While many of us look forward to summer

weather and vacations, there are a few of us who must plan for some important events in the summer. I am referring to Lions Officer Training, the annual sessions that welcome Lions who have made the commitment to take a leadership role in our clubs. Our "staff", namely members of GLT and GMT, are experienced Lions who enjoy talking about our organization and who are anxious to help our clubs succeed. I have been involved with our District training for the last 10 years, and I am very proud of how much our program has grown, but more importantly, how many Lions actually attend our sessions. This past summer, there have been four valuable training sessions that are highlighted below.

TRAINING OUR LEADERS Each fiscal year, which starts in July, we welcome a new District Governor and cabinet officers. One of the most important District leaders in Lions, is the Zone Chair. These Lions are past presidents who have been appointed to assist 4-6 clubs in our district. It's important that they are informed with the current issues of our association and the new District Governor. The first training session of the season was for the nine Zone Chairs on June 17.

SECRETARY TRAINING

The second training session occurred on July 13 for Club Secretaries. Lion Denise Kelly, who has probably trained every secretary over the past 10 years, again provided an informative and detailed seminar on navigating the Lions website and club contest reporting. The training has come a long way; all that's needed is a laptop computer and Wi-Fi.

THE BIG SHOW

On July 20, the week after training secretaries, the Team setup at Parkside Middle School for the annual Club Officer Orientation & Leadership Training. Nearly 100 Lions officers attended the 3hour "crash course" on club officer duties and operating a Lions club. It is always a pleasure to see the attendees, especially at the end when they have a look of

accomplishment, meaning they learned something. I want to thank PCC Emil Kantola for his contributing to the presentation he's always available to help. I was also pleased to hand the microphone to Lions Amy Fink, Sandee Ige, Ora Seyler and Margaret Lee - to share their knowledge and successes. In addition, Lion Kathryn Marinos provided an informative presentation on the Internet and Social Media. However, the highlight of the session appeared to be the Mock Board Meeting. Although it can be a very serious part of your club's function, we had a lot of fun during the make believe meeting.

THE BIGGER SHOW

To keep the ball rolling, President & Vice President Training was offered the following Saturday on July 27 at the Parkside Middle School Library. The fifth year of President Training turned out to be the best ever. Over 40 attendees, including 21 club presidents and 20 vice presidents, representing 27 Lions clubs - a great turnout. The session was 6 hours long and included breakfast and lunch. The topics included a brief primer on Lions Clubs

Agenda: Opening Eyes Program at the Int'l Convention was discussed as a way to help needs of Special Olympics. One highlight I found exciting was the Binder that the club gives to every member that includes info on club officers, Lions info, and a year long calendar with important dates on them, including member birthdays. The club is planning a joint venture Rocky Lombardi Memorial Picnic with Millbrae, San Bruno, Burlingame on September 15. The club was debating on changing their venue because of low attendance



Participants view a PowerPoint presentation and polling questions on their computer. They listen to the instructors either via their computer speakers or headset. The participants may use the phone for audio/ speaking or a computer headset with microphone to interact in discussions and respond to questions asked by the instructors, similar to training conducted in a classroom.


My second important event was attending the
