The first Council of Governors meeting is coming up August 1-4 in Walnut Creek. Three and a half days of meetings and deep discussions.


Looking forward to starting my official Governor visits to the Clubs in August, so be on the lookout.



US\$1,000 MJF contribution with a unique pin for each giving level.

After contributing US\$100,000, donors become Humanitarian Partners. The Humanitarian Partner program honors individuals whose cumulative donations exceed US\$100,000, \$200,000, \$300,000 and \$500,000, respectively. Recipients receive an elegant bronze, silver, gold or platinum pin, respectively. The program has recently introduced new pin levels recognizing donations in US\$20,000 increments through the US\$300,000 level. Like the PMJF Program, each level receives a unique pin with different stones and metal types. San Mateo & Foster City Lions Serve Fire Victims at ARC Shelter




