


## message from your District Governor Steve Picchi

#### Lions Veterans Charities Report

Projects we provide each year:

1) Our support of the USO at SFO, which provides supplies at a minimum of every 60 days or whenever they are low and in need, and more often during the holiday period of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. This support currently requires our financial support of approximately \$6,000 to \$9,000 per year.

2) Supplies to the troops requires us to collect various personal items, such as shampoo, body cream, insect repellant, and other personal needs as well as snacks, high energy bars, beef jerky, and other needs for our troops in the field or overseas. Yesterday, instead of our normal procedure of us sending supplies, we delivered four large boxes of personal supplies to the American Legion Post #82 in San Mateo, for their use in sending supplies to member families in the service.

3) Collection of used cell phones which are then traded for telephone cards, which are then given to our troops to be used for telephoning from anywhere in the world to spouses, families, friends, etc. for one-hour without cost.

4) Organizing to assist any District Lions Clubs for projects with VA hospitals and other veterans or groups. Currently, we have assisted Foster City Lions on their third year of an annual buffet luncheon at the Palo Alto VA Hospital, consisting of a six course Chinese lunch with drinks, dessert and live entertainment; this last luncheon served over 100 room-bound patients unable to be at the cafete-

ria and over 100 at the dining room. We also assist other Lions Clubs with any special veterans projects and other veterans organizations in the Bay Area. 5) Our fishing trips continue; the veterans are from the Menlo Park VA Hospital and the sign-up for trips for up to 20 are usually filled within 1-3 days. The lucky veterans who catch salmon, rockfish or halibut usually take their catch back to the hospital, which are then served the next day for lunch or dinner. We have a special arrangement with the "Lovely Martha" out of Fisherman's Wharf, San Francisco; we provided coffee and sweet rolls for breakfast, a lunch plate, soft drinks all day, fishing license, rod and reel, tackle and deckhands who assist the veterans. The trips start at 5-6AM and usually are back at the dock by 2-3PM. The entire cost per trip to LVC is approximately \$2,100, which includes a discount for the boat owned by a Lion Trustee of LVC.




