Lions it's April 22nd we have about 10 weeks left in this Lions year, it's not too late to bring in new members to our Clubs. Don't forget the members

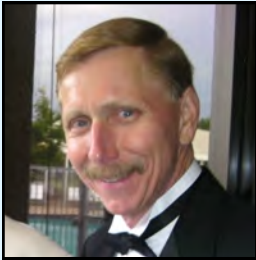

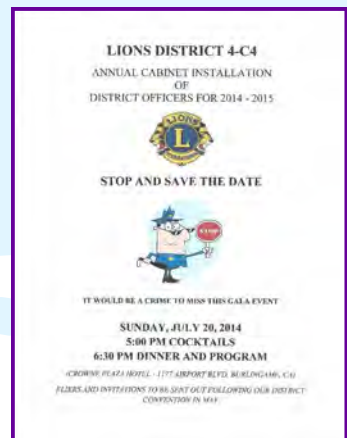

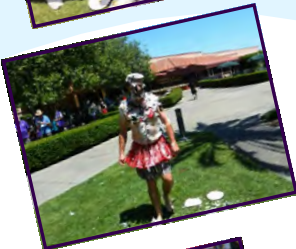

pins. The Clubs in the District who provided the food it was excellent and well done.

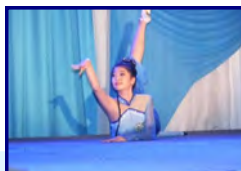

grand children and great grandchildren. PDG Ray owned the Burlingame British Car Dealership in Burlingame and had also served as a past director for the Burlingame Chamber of Commerce. Lion PDG Ray loved cars, but turned to real estate later in life.

Lion PDG Ray was a proud member of the Burlingame Lions

Club for 47 years and served in just about every leadership position within the club. Known affectionately as "Handsome Ray," he served as President of the Burlingame Lions Club from 1973-1974 and also served as Governor of District 4-C4 in 1987-1988. PDG Ray was always an active member of the Burlingame Lions Club and was recently involved in leading the Burlingame Lions Club's Membership Committee, helping to bring in new members into his club and into the Lions Family.
