

## An Open Letter from PIP Bill Biggs—Mike Butler for 2nd VP



June 26, 2014 To my Fellow Lions,

My name is William L. "Bill" Biggs. I

served as President of Lions Clubs International in 1990 and 1991. I have been a Lion a long time.

I am writing this letter to all of you to share with you my thoughts on the major events coming up at our International Convention in Toronto.

First to the candidates:
This is the first year in many
years that we have had a contest
for the position that will ultimately produce a President of our Association. The election is for
Second International Vice
President, but it really is the
selection of our President two
years hence.

The question is, what do we want, not what do two or three officers who are currently serving want? It's not just their Association, it's ours. All of you as Lions have a stake in our future.

Personally, I know both candidates. I served with Past International Director Mike Butler on several occasions and in various capacities. I had never met the other candidate until after he was endorsed by the executive

officers. I observed him make a presentation in California and answer questions; however, I have never observed him in a leadership capacity.

Lion Corlew was a District Governor four years ago. Three years ago, he was a Council Chairman in Tennessee. He was then immediately elected to the International Board and served two years. From being a Governor in 2009 to being endorsed by the executive officers before he was even off the board (that's four years, my friends), he now stands as a candidate for Second International Vice President.

By contrast, Lion Mike Butler, a Past International Director from Texas, joined the Association in 1974 and has demonstrated his leadership and organizational skills through active participation and involvement at every level of our Association. He is a member of the Texas Lions Hall of Fame I served with him from 1984 through 1986 while he was in his two-year term on the International Board of Directors. As Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, it was his responsibility to guide through the process the amendment to allow women to join Lions Clubs International, making our Association one of the leading proponents of service by women at all levels in the Association.

There was a reason he served on the Long Range Planning Committee - because he has a vision for the future. He served on the Planning Committee for the USA/ Canada Lions Leadership Forum representing the International Board of Directors. He then served another one-vear term on the Board as an appointed member and as an active participant on the International Board Realignment Development Committee. He has served both as Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and as a member of the Finance and Headquarters Committee involved in the initial planning for our centennial year.

He served two years as a group leader at the Governor-elect school and as Vice-Chairman of the Nominating Committee. In 2011, he was chairman of the Resolutions Committee. One of his greatest achievements was serving as World Chairman of the newly-formed Global Membership Team in 2009. He traveled throughout the world leading forums on the development of the Global Membership Team, which today has realized positive growth for Lions Clubs International. With sixteen Presidential Awards and a life membership, as well as a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, he is clearly the choice of the Lions to serve on the Executive

Committee and he is certainly my choice.

There are three reasons I would suggest to you that you put Mike Butler clearly as the preferred candidate of the Lions of the World. One is his experience. None of the things that I have mentioned in terms of his service to Lionism can be duplicated by the other candidate, who simply has not had any experience in the Governor-elect school, on the Global Membership Team, USA/ Canada Lions Leadership Forum, the Realignment Committee, or any other committee of the Association. He was simply not in the picture prior to be selected from the sitting Board as a candidate by a majority of the executive officers.

The second reason is personality. Meet both of the candidates; compare how they make you feel about the Association and about them. My impression is that Mike Butler inspires, he motivates, and he brings people together so that you and I want to do more and achieve greater success through the Association.

Finally, the reason I am voting for and supporting Mike Butler, is his commitment to the Association.

Mike Butler has not won every election when he stood for office.

He has lost, but he didn't quit,

and he won't quit now, win, lose or draw. He is committed as a Lion. He has made a difference. He knows it. So do you.

With his knowledge of membership and the history of Lions Clubs International, Lion Mike Butler spreads enthusiasm and passion for our Association through positive and motivational presentations to Lions around the world. Your choice, my choice for an executive officer position.

The second issue:

This issue, which I will not discuss in this letter, but needs to be addressed by the Board and our entire Association, is how we go about selecting the candidates for office. That process can either enhance or detract from our image as an Association.

In the early 1980's, our Association was blessed by having as President a man from Northern Ireland, Bert Mason. He taught me two things. The first is that on my badge, ahead of the word Director is another word. That word is international. He taught us to think internationally but to act locally. He also talked about good politics and bad politics. He get along with each other in our families, our churches, our groups, and even in our Lions Association. By contrast, he defined bad politics as political

action designed to hurt people and destroy lives.

It's up to you and I whether the politics in Lions Clubs
International are good or whether the politics are bad. Could the political system be better in your opinion, because it's your vote that counts. I believe the election of Mike Butler will make a fundamental change in how we go about the decision-making process in the Association.

How an organization brings its future leadership to the fore says a lot about how it will function as an organization. I personally believe we are not even close to getting that right. The world in which we function has changed, and yet we are working with policies and procedures that governed us fifty years ago. That needs to change. We need to come of age. We have the talent. We have the people. Past International President Sid Scruggs pointed out that we have a broken system. We can go about fixing this starting with Toronto, then it needs to be seriously addressed and changed if we are going to continue to grow and serve as all of us hope we do.

I hope you have taken the time to


