- President Tom Lara of San Bruno.

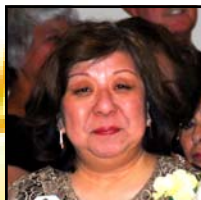
They were all in the hospital and hopefully all are at home resting.

The evening was an elegant affair with the hotel ballroom brimming with close to 500 Peninsula Police, Firefighters, Lions dignitaries and guests. In

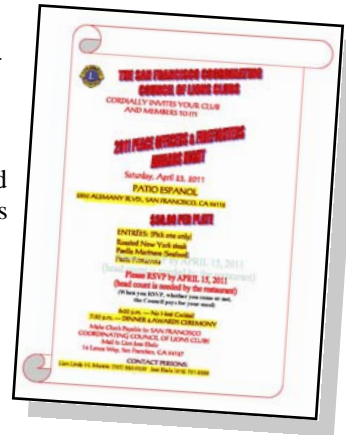
