NEW TAX FILING REQUIREMENT— AFFECTS LIONS CLUBS

If you are a small tax-exempt organization that normally has annual gross receipts of \$25,000 or less and does not have to file Form 990 or 990-EZ, you must file the e-Postcard (990-N) If you do not, you risk losing your tax

If your fiscal year is July 1—June 30, you need to file no later than November 15, 2008. Club Presidents should have received a letter explaining the requirement. If you have not received the letter, or if you have questions, please contact Lion Mike Simonini.
