


Spotlight: SF Circle Lions Linda & Billy Morete

I am Lion Linda Hernandez married to Lion Billardo Moselina Morete, known to many as Billy. Regarding Billy's educational background, he attended the Mapua Institute of Technology in the Philippines for his Mechanical Engineering Course, specializing in auto mechanics.

He joined the Lions organization in 1993, and has been very active in the association for 15 years now. In the year 2000 he received a 100% president award in the previous Lions Club he was affiliated with, and again in the year

2007 when he was charter president of the newly chartered club. the SF Circle Lions Club he received another 100% president award.

On the other side, Linda, as my peers fondly call



I joined the Lions organization in the year 2000, and has been a very active member since then. I, too, is a recipient of a 100% president award in 2004 when I was president of the Lions Club where I previously belonged. In the past four years, that I served as secretary, I am proud to say that all of them are 100% secretary award. Currently, I am working for a 5th 100% secretary award.

In spite of all these awards we received, we are simple people, living a very simple life sharing the best we can in terms of time, effort, energy, and little money to people who are in real need: people who are wanting of help, people who are deserving of assistance.

In order to do these services, the SFCLC through our leadership, performs some money generating activities like Lion Linda H. Morete

the Casino Trips, Crab Feast, Christmas Caroling, etc. The proceeds earned from these activities are earmarked for the club's on-going projects: Operation Yule, Medical Mission, and Eye Sight Restoration Activity.

The Operation Yule is like Christmas in any month of the year, where we distribute bags of rice and grocery items to some 250 to 300 indigent families in our home country, who are suffering in poverty, at least to alleviate their impoverished living condition, searching for food to

fill in their empty stomach. For the Medical Mission, we invite doctors, a pharmacist, and a nurse who offer free time and services to give free medical check-up and treatment through the medicine our club is providing. The Eye Sight Restoration Activity is being performed in partnership with our twin club's program in the Philippines, the Olongapo Host Lions Club's "Share-a-Patient Eye Cataract Operation Program." The minimum amount that our club donates a year is \$850.00, treatment for 10 cataract pa-

tients. The \$85.00 cost of operation per patient is not enough, but our twin club subsidizes the rests of the expenses. As a proof of treatment, the OHLC awards each donor, a certificate of appreciation with the name and picture of the patient he/she helped, including a letter of thanks from the patient herself. To do all these projects, the club needs at least \$4,250.00. This year, our club can only do Operation Yule and Eye Sight Restoration Activity.

For our other services in Lionism, Billy and myself volunteered in sorting used eye glasses every Friday of each month, at the Lions In Sight Warehouse at Lemon Street at Vallejo. And for this, the couple in charge (I can't recall their name at this time of writing), provided us our own key to the warehouse so that we can go there any time we have a free time.

To check our attendance, we write our club's name with our names at the huge calendar on the wall. This is where every volunteer sign their presence.



Spotlight: SF Geneva Mission Lion Bre Martinez Jones

Lion Bre Jones was inducted into the San Francisco Geneva Mission Lions Club in February 2003. Although this was her first official induction her service and involvement in Lionism happened many years before that night. Her grandfather, PDG Emigdio "Mickey" Martinez, had been part of Lions before Bre was born in 1976. She started attending events (with Mickey) upon her arrival and even was pictured in The Lion Magazine at 2 years old. Growing up in and with the Lion motto "We Serve" was an important trait that Mickey would instill in all 9 of his grandchildren. Attending meetings, events and fundraisers on a regular basis while on vacation with her grandparents was the norm. In 2002, on a trip to North Carolina, Mickey asked her to be the grandchild to carry on the Lion legacy. She agreed and got immediately to work to find a club near her office and soon thereafter was inducted as the first female member of the Geneva Mis-

sion Lions Club. Since her induction she has served as Secretary, 1st Vice President, and President for the Club. She is also actively involved in the Youth and Community Raffle as a Co-Chair. This year she was also honored to serve Lion Maxine as the District Flag Day Chairman. She hopes to continue her



service as a Lion for many years to come.

Today I have no CSF II video.

Today I won't harp on the fact that \$1000 will save the sight of 167 people.

Today I won't tell you that some clubs in the final 160 days of this campaign are rock stars and some can do better.

Today I want to tell you about a woman born in the back woods of Maine. She was 80% blind and 80% deaf from birth.

She was adopted into a family that believed that opportunity

came through education. So, she was sent to the Perkins Academy in Boston then onto UC Berkeley.

After getting a degree in Psychology, she returned to the Perkins Academy to work as a teacher and a counselor. She was one of the first advocates of "tough love".



All over this country the Gideon Society has placed a Bible in every hotel room. In it you will fine the Gospels, the first 4 books of the New Testament. This takes up roughly 50 pages 8 ½" x 11". These Braille books cover that same information.

To live successfully with disabilities takes drive and intelligence. It also takes help from others.

This woman was no stranger to me. She was my sister who died January 31st at the age of 73.

Student Speaker Foundation Report by Lion Rich Picchi



The Student Speaker Contest is a tremendous way for students to prepare and deliver a speech on topics of national interest. Each student must research, write and deliver his/her own speech and they are then judged on the quality of both the delivery and of the preparation.

Our public schools don't seem to be able to afford public speaking programs anymore, so it is difficult to get students interested in our program. One of the ways we have to combat this lack of enthusiasm, is through offering scholarships and cash awards to the winners of all of our contests. Each club and district provides the cash prizes at the club, zone and region levels, but the Student Speaker Foundation provides scholarships at the District (\$4,500), Area (\$6,500) and MD4 (\$10,000) level. In fact, over \$100,000 is given away annually to the 15 district winners, the 4 area winners and the MD4 winner.

District 4C4 speakers have won their fair share by winning over \$24,000 of scholarships in the past three years alone. The Student Speaker Foundation needs to continue, and in fact, increase these awards to continue to attract speakers at all levels of t he contest. So the Student



Speaker Foundation has asked each district to provide \$4,500 in funding to the scholarship fund. Governor

Maxine is extremely proud of our achievements in the speakers program and is very committed to raising the

\$4,500 in 4C4.



To provide incentive to our clubs, 4C4 will be giving an award to the two clubs who have donated the most funds. To qualify for

the award, make sure that your donation has your club name and "4C4" on the form.

Contributions can be made in several ways:

- Fellowships: There are 4 different fellowships available, starting at \$200 and going up to \$500. You will receive a plaque and a special lapel pin as a thank you. Fellowships are a great way to reward a member of your club for outstanding service to your club.
- Club Supporter: For a \$100 donation, your club will receive a banner patch and a year chevron for each succeeding year that a contribution is received.
- Donations: Donations in any amount are welcome for memorials, birthdays, anniversaries, etc.

Beautiful Weather Greets Lions at 3rd District Cabinet Meeting



TO CREATE and foster a spirit of "GENEROUS CONSIDERATION" among the peoples of the world through a study of the problems of international relationship.TO PROMOTE the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship.

TO TAKE an active interest in the civic, social, and moral welfare of the community. TO UNITE the members in the bonds of friendship and mutual understanding.

TO PROVIDE a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest, partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted.

TO ENCOURAGE efficacy and promote high ethical standards and professions: provided that no club shall hold out as one of its objects financial benefits to its members.
