





PDG Roger Chinn is asking all Lions to once again help our veterans!

Everyone was very generous last year, but USO at SFO serves 1600-2500 troops per month and will be out of coffee by the end of March. Can you help again? Donate coffee, or write a check to Lions Veterans Charities.

Another project which we have expanded this year throughout 4-C4 is collecting and shipping personal supplies to our troops. Our men and women in remote areas, especially in war zones, have been without personal items due to the lack of facilities. We have developed a list of those needs and received donations from clubs, which we then box and send off to troops, to units and location recommended by senior officers or organizations. To date, we have sent out 10 shipments of 780 pounds of personal needs.

Other News: LVC is now entering our ninth year of hosting veterans on all-day, all-paid fishing trips in San Francisco Bay or out in the Pacific; the veterans are patients of the Palo Alto VA Hospital in Menlo Park. We have found that the trips have been helpful towards uplifting the spirit of our veterans, away for a day from doctors, nurses, medication and treatments. This past onehalf Lions' year, we were co-hosted by nine of our Lions Clubs and the San Francisco Police Department. More info? Contact us!

On January 17 a group of doctors, nurses, dentists and volunteers traveled through the mountainous roads of Benguet, Philippines to serve people devastated by recent typhoons. Lions Roger and Maggie Gulen were part of



the Optometry Team, Lion Dr. Herman Valle of SF host and Lion Dr. Augusto Valera of Fil-Am were part of the Surgery Team. Patients filled the halls of Benguet General Hospital from early in the morning for free services. At the end of the week, a total of 1167 patients were given corrective or reading glasses, 115 patients were referred to local optometrists or ophthalmologists and 500 patients were given sunglasses or frames.

A total of 1136 patients were served by the group, including SF Host Henry Lasat and Espie Agbayani.

> Next, Lions Maggie and Roger headed for the town of Alaminos City, to Balangobong Elementary School, where they distributed school supplies, dictionaries, wall clocks, books and magazines, donated by SF Host members and friends. Used clothing, shoes, vitamins and medicines were also distributed


