

Millbrae Lions Join Forces to Rejuvenate Vandalized Scout House

The goal of this project is to repair and upgrade the building to return it to service as a City owned Youth Center. We have many partners in this venture, including the City of Millbrae, the Millbrae Elementary School District Board of Trustees, the Millbrae Rotary Club, the Millbrae Community Foundation, the Millbrae Leos Club, the Chamber of Commerce, the Central Peninsula Church, the Peninsula Chinese Business Association, the Boys

and Girls Clubs of the Peninsula, and Rebuilding Together Peninsula Chapter. And there are more.

Last year we worked with our partners to do a whole bunch of cleanup, some prep painting,

restart electricity, add an alarm system, and then we began design work for seismic upgrades and ADA requirements.

Now, we hope to start work on the building in the

next two months. We have resources for quite a bit of the labor, but we need to buy the materials. For instance, a donation of \$7,000 pays for concrete and railings to install a wheel chair ramp. A donation of \$2,000 would provide a refrigerator. A donation
