Club Membership Growth Challenge from Lion VDG Emil Kantola

Part of the Lions International membership program this year is a challenge in growth of membership in each Lions Club. A Club president who achieve a net growth in club membership, as outlined below, will receive the corresponding pin from Lions International to recognize their achievement.

Net growth of 2 members - 1 crystal Net growth of 4 members - 2 crystals Net growth of 6 members - 3 crystals Net growth of 8 members - 4 crystals Net growth of 10 members - 5 crystals

Our district has a goal of a net increase in membership 45 by the end of this year. If each club within the district achieves a net increase of two members, the district goal will be met and the club president will receive a pin to commemorate the challenge. If the District receives a net increase in membership as of March 31, 2008 the District Governor can

recommend a Lion from within the District to receive an International Leadership Award and if the District receives a net increase in membership as of June 30, 2008 the District Governor can recommend a Lion from within the District to receive an International Presidential Award.

A patient is sitting up in bed. A doctor is completing a careful examination of his eyes. Everything looks good. The patient smiles. His sight has been restored. The operation has gone well.

In the United States, such a scene would be taken for granted. It happens all the time. But in Zambales, and other barrios of the Philippines, it is like a miracle. This

is because many here are so poor that they can hardly afford the necessities of life. Any hope of having an operation to

have little hope of seeing well again.

In the United States, the average cost of cataract surgery is \$3,000. In the province of Zambales in the Philippines,

it is only a fraction of this.

When the call for help went out from SF Premier, one, then two, then four and more members volunteered to help. In a matter of weeks, there were pledges not only from members but also from friends, so that by May 27th, the club was able to col-

Also donated was \$200 for their Food Drive, 165 used eveglasses, and a brand-new blood pressure cuff and stethoscope.


And just as SF Premier joined hands with Olongapo Host




