members, we are now down to 42 clubs and as of this day (June 21) we are DOWN to 1,235 members a drop of 116 members from our start. We added 139 new members and dropped 255 members (dropped clubs accounted for 35 of the drops) and we had 24 deaths but the dropping of over 50 DUES PAYING members for non-attendance is just not the way to go.

I have news for some clubs, you have to collect dues from your members and you must pay LCI and MD-4 TWICE a year.

One of the problems in the district is the lack of

information that the members get, the plan was that the district newsletter editor sends out the newsletter via e-mail to all those that he has listed and then comes the HARD part. Each club was supposed to forward that information on to their members, for some reason that has not been happening. At convention, the visiting ID knew more about what was going on in our district than many members knew.



Even children of well-off parents are attracted to study at the Highlands School because of its tested success. With deep desire and compassion, the Highlanders, although just a few have deep pockets, remain courageous to make a difference in the community they serve.

This is the first largest-scale mission project since June 2006 that the SF Highlands Lions Club has got into. Students are trained for two solid years on how to read and write as well as how to be good citizens. They prepare them to move forward to their next grade with confidence.

With its dedicated staff, the Highlands First-Step Learning Center has gained a reputation of not only being superior but a caring learning school. Graduated students are regarded as "well-taught and highly-disciplined" children by the community. As

MISSION SCHOOL UPDATE. This is the school's 6th year of operation with an annual budget of \$25K, of which 80-90% is normally footed by Lion Flor. It has six full-salaried staff consisting of a chaplain, principal, two teachers, one teacher's aide and a security/janitor. It provides 100% scholarship to students including tuition, books, school supplies, transportation, uniforms, shoes, meals and other expenses.

such, top students are favorably exempt from entrance tests at their next grade level. Proud parents are dreaming of brighter future for their kids.

Fifty preschoolers were accepted for the school year 2011-2012. From June 2006 thru March 2011, the school has graduated a total of two hundred forty-two students. Thirty-five percent of the annual graduates attain honor rolls at their next grade level.

FINANCIAL RESOURCES. Under the strong leadership of Lion Flor Camota, Chair of Missions, the club has raised a total of \$45K for the year ending




