District Governor's Message for March 2004

Dear Fellow Lions:

What did I say about the month of February? Did I say it has been historic? Well fellow Lions, it has not abated an iota even through the month of March!

Let me backtrack to a "feel-good" news. Our So. California neighbors who suffered in the devastating fire send their thanks to our district and to five (5) clubs, through DG's of 4-L5, DG Hugh Grant and of 4-L6 John Kirk. A donation of \$2000 from our district (motion presented by PDG Ray Kliewer and approved by the body); club donations of \$1000 from Pacifica, \$200 from San Francisco Host, \$200 from So. SF Golden Gate, \$200 San Carlos, and \$100 from Redwood City Sunrise were divided equally between 4L5 and 4-L6. On behalf of their respective districts, the DG's want to let us know how grateful they are to 4-C4.

As I've promised in February, the following is a report on the MD4 Convention in Primm. On a personal note, let me tell you that there is indeed a price to pay when fun is had, though not all the time. I came back to my home turf with an asthma attack and bronchitis. It is not hard to figure out why. Smoke-filled air abounds everywhere even in so-called non-smoking rooms in hotels.

At any rate, it was gratifying to see many Lions from 4-C4 in attendance; Lions from Burlingame, SF Chinatown, Daly City Gateway, Foster City, So. SF Golden Gate, Ocean Ingleside, San Carlos, San Francisco Host, and Sunset (I hope not to have missed anyone, if I did, please advise.) were among the 1167 lions and guests at the Convention. Out of 630 certified delegates, 561 actually voted. Two (2) major amendments to the Constitution MD4 and nine amendments to the By-Laws--partly housekeeping changes were ratified. Fresno was voted as the venue for the 2007 MD4 Convention. Quite a number of Lions received Presidential Awards. Leadership Medals, and International

President Certificates of Appreciation. Please attend our Annual Convention in May to find out who the 4-C4 awardees are-the recipients don't know either--and to congratulate them for the highly-deserved recognition of their commitment to Lionism.

The eight-and-one-half hours drive one-way to Primm was no sweat for me. Thanks to Cabinet Secretary Lion Chester and Lion Thelma Ajero for giving me a ride to and from Primm. We covered 530 miles of beautiful California terrain and a few miles of remains of wintry-look along Nevada.

Two (2) weeks after returning from the MD4 Convention, I took off for Cayucos, CA upon the invitation of DG George Stewart of 4-A3 and his wife Lynn, as guest of their 3rd Cabinet Meeting. On the following week, I was at 4C6 3rd Cabinet Meeting in San Jose, as guest of DG Steve Brown and his wife Sandy. VDG Ray Rosenthal and Christina were guests of VDG Larry Hidalgo wife Martie. Our administrative assistant Lion Beth Yulo drove and I was the navigator for both out-of-district trips. Fellow Lions, this is one of the "perks" of being the current DG or VDG. We invite each other to our cabinet meetings or conventions. This experience provides an avenue for sharing of ideas, exchange of innovative projects to expand and improve our service to those in need, in addition to having fun in the process because we get to meet Lions from other districts.

The Student Speakers Contest had been underway; club levels would have been completed by February 23rd and zone levels will have been completed by March 15th; by April 12th is the completion date for region levels; May 3rd is that of the district level; for area level competition with districts C2, C3, and C6 completion date is by May 24th.
