May is just about over and Lion Paul Larson sent out his usual email, "I need your article for the District News Letter now". So here it is Lion Paul.



months at which time the Lions will again fill the pantry of the USO/SFO.

This USO serves over 2,000 military guests a month (and more during the holidays), many of them servicemen and women and veterans, those who are traveling out of SFO or coming home, and family members and friends there to bid good by or greet them home from duties elsewhere in the world. Many will be USO guests waiting for connecting flights, or just waiting for arrivals and departures. Almost all USO personnel are volunteers, dedicated to serving the flow of their "military guests".



patriotic community parade in downtown San Mateo at 11am followed by a BBQ and family festivities in Central Park on May 27th.








Lion Michael Chan gives praise to Lion Veteran Paul Cademartori
