Since 1992, Lions Clubs International (LCI) has presented a float in the New Years Day Tournament of Roses Parade, in Pasadena, California. Two entries have won awards for the most beautiful float in the parade. However, all entries have been winners promoting the service activities Lions provide on a worldwide basis.

The Tournament of Roses Parade is seen by an estimated 400 million people in 85 countries. Parade coverage and associated articles are presented worldwide in various forms of media

Lions Float Inc. is a non-profit corporation formed in 1994 to direct the preparation and funding of the annual Lions Float. This is a yearround activity involving design, fundraising, and directing volunteers in float decoration each December.

LCI has typically provided approximately half the funds required with the remainder being raised in several ways.

Lions Float Inc. offers two special avenues by which you can provide support to this magnificent display of floral design that tells our story for all the world to see. These new ways are with a recently adopted fellowship program. The Donald E. Banker Fellowship will be provided for a donation of \$500 US. This fellowship honors the 1991-1992 president of LCI, the year of our first Lions float. As president, he served as our goodwill ambassador, visiting more than 100 countries and telling both religious and political leaders of our Lions legacy. Additionally, PIP Banker was the first to ride a Lions Float in the 1992 parade. He has been, and continues to be, a great supporter.

The Wilt LeBlanc Fellowship will be awarded for a donation of \$250. US. Past District Governor LeBlanc was dedicated to this project and displayed great leadership skills in bringing it to fruition. He was greatly involved from its inception in 1991 until his death in 2002.

The first 100 fellowships of each category will be numbered. Each fellowship includes a beautiful plaque and a decorative lapel pin.

Adult turkeys have about 3,500 feathers.

Last year, about 45 million turkeys were eaten at Thanksgiving, 22 million at Christmas, and 19 million at Faster.

Only tom (male) turkeys gobble. Hens make clicking noise.

Domesticated turkeys cannot fly. Wild turkeys can fly for short distances up to 55 miles per hour.

A 15 pound turkey typically has 70 percent white meat and 30 percent dark meat. White meat has fewer calories and less fat and is generally preferred in the United States, while dark meat is favored in most other countries.

We were only allowed three practices before the International Dragon Boat Races, but we all felt ready. The paddles felt natural in our hands. We knew the feeling of the PFD's strapped around our upper bodies. We knew how to step into the dragon boat. We knew how to sit on the dragon boat. We were ready.

When we won the third place medal, it felt fantastic, Roar, Roar, Roar,


