

Spotlight: Bayview Hunters Point Lion Frances Luster

Frances Luster, a residence of South San Francisco for approximately thirty years, has been an involved community activist and organizer, helping to improve the quality of life of South San Francisco's citizens, especially in the Westborough area. Some of the activities she has been involved in are: * Getting citizens to vote * Organizing safety awareness programs * Organizing the Christmas tree lighting ceremony in Westborough park.

In addition, Frances was Vice President and Board Member for the child care center, Friends to Parents, for eleven years. Her involvements with the center included promotional goodwill between parents, instructors and adminis-

trators. She also was actively involved in fundraising, visiting the classrooms to evaluate and observe teacher/children interaction. On behalf of the Westborough Braewood #2 Homeowners Association, she organized the Christmas tree lighting ceremony in Westborough Park.

Frances attended San Francisco State University of California, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology and a Master of Science degree in Rehabilitation Counseling. Her lifetime credentials include the Community College Credential, California Teachers' Credential, and Standard Service Credential – Pupil Personnel. She was also elected as

the President of California Probation Parole Correctional Association in 2002.

Frances has 10+ years experience in counseling, supervising, and lecturing high-risk, violent, diverse inmates and youths in the different San Francisco and San Mateo city and county facilities. * 1973 - Juvenile Probation Officer for the City and County of San Francisco * 1977 - Supervisor at the Department of Rehabilitation in San Francisco * 1980 - Counselor for Family Service Agency as a Counselor for the Teenage Pregnancy and Parenting program on anger management and self esteem issues * 1984 - Probation Officer in the Adult Probation Department of the City and County of San Francisco as a Probation Officer. In this position, she worked in the Mental Health, Child Abuse and Domes-

tic Violence units * 2004 - Counselor for the San Mateo Juvenile Center until 2006

Frances Luster's only son was murdered in San Francisco in 1990. As a result of this tragedy, she has made a mission of working to stop the cycle of violence toward all citizens, especially children. She is victim-driven, and committed to making a difference in the community. To accomplish this, she has volunteered for several victims group, including: * Justice for Murdered Victims * Parents of Murdered Children * Children as Peace Makers * Inner City Adolescent Network, Inc. * Crime

Victims United * The Healing Circle

Frances also works with the Victims' Assistant Program, which is through the District Attorney's office and the Domestic Violence Program administered by the Adult Probation Department. She has lectured in various venues to inmates about the effects of violence on their victims, including: *Sheriff's Department County of San Francisco Restorative Justice program for Adult men * California Youth Authority (various locations) * Juvenile Centers of San Mateo and San Francisco

She also has traveled to Ghana, West

Africa and Washington, DC to promote "Stop the Clock of Violence".

Frances is very active in community and service organizations. * Current President - Park and Place Commission in South San Francisco - Westborough Braewood #2 Homeowners' Association * Chairperson - Health Committee for Alpha Kappa Alpha San Francisco chapter - Domestic Violence committee of the International Professional Women's Soroptimist Organization of Northern San Mateo County - International Service Organization Bayview Hunter's Point Lions Club (Charter Member)


Friday, November 2, 2007, I attended the San Francisco Citywide Public High
