
TEAM MATES!!!





MEET REGION 3 - ZONE 2

San Carlos Lions Club

Chartered March 31, 1938 as the Lions Club of San Carlos-Belmont. With the onset of World War II the original group of charter members dwindled, however many prominent citizens were members and managed to carry on. In 1946 things picked up and the club numbered 40 active members and introduced Western Night and instigated a roast BBQ night, followed by White Cane, and Little League Baseball . During the Korean War the club started "Operation Popcorn"-a club project which involved sending popcorn to soldiers serving in Korea.

The Club participated in Chickens Ball in 1962 and has continued involvement in the show to be more visual in the community. A major project of love and a monumental undertaking known as the San Carlos Museum was completed and dedicated to the City of San Carlos as a lasting tribute to remind the community of Lions who cared.

The Club purchased a van for St. Anthony's Padua Dining Hall and joined with local Rotary and Kiwanis Club clubs to purchase a van for the City's Special Needs Children. The dream of deceased member Vince Bruno became a reality when the San Carlos Service Clubs for Seniors was founded. The clubs helps monthly with the "Caring Cupboard" a much-needed food program. In addition to all of their district committees and projects they maintain a high profile with their Adopt-A-Highway involvement.

Redwood Shores Lions Club

Chartered June 28, 1991 under the sponsorship of the Foster City Lions Club. The club is involved not only in multiple district committees and foundations, but in numerous local community projects such as Redwood City Homeless Shelter, Senior Citizens programs, and youth scholarship programs. The club helped renovate the Daytop house, a teen drug rehabilitation program and has established a partnership with Sandpiper School to provide not only financial assistance, but vol-

unteer services as well.

In addition to local and district activity the club has also been active internationally. In 1992 the Club became a sister club with the Lions Club of Geelong Eastern Suburb Inc.of Australia and in 1994 formed a sister club relationship with the Lions Club of Bangkok Dusita and the Lions Club of Cha bahil, Nepal.

The club is very family friendly as they bring their children along to Sandpiper Community Center. The club continues to partner with clubs in their area in the "Save The Music" program. The club recently had a food tasting event for their scholarship program and is now engaged in their major fund raiser by selling of Lumpia, Bibinka, Leche Flan, Leche Flan Cake, and Tres Leches Cake.




Although only 20 members strong, the club continues to serve the needs of Their Community and District 4-C4.

Redwood City Sunrise

Chartered on November 2, 1966 the Redwood City Sunrise Club was formed by many members of the Redwood City Downtown Club who felt that we needed a breakfast club to serve the needs of the community. The early fund raiser was a haunted house with an almost 2 month commitment from the membership earning them an award for the most outstanding service project among all service clubs in the area. It was known not only as a fund raiser, but also a "Fun Raiser". Former member Bob Rose (deceased) was instrumental in forming our District Eye Glass Collection program.

The club now raises funds by participating with food booths in the Palo Alto Concours d'Elegance, Redwood City 4th of July Parade,

Palo Alto Airport, and a Pancake Breakfast. In addition the club sponsored a Green Car Show which featured high mileage cars as well as electric vehicles and an experimental car from SJSU. . Plans are to expand the show to include electric plug-ins and hopefully cars such as the Tesla. The club also cosponsored a Veterans Day Program and gave



away 200 Hot Dogs with drinks and chips. The program received considerable coverage from TV and press and had many high profile dignitaries attending.

Sunrise is only 17 members strong, but remains a stalwart member of District 4-C4 by participating not only in District and International projects, but members spend many hours participating in Community Service. Club motto has been- "Last Down At Night-First Up In The Morning".

Redwood City Fair Oaks

Chartered April 20, 2008 under the sponsorship of the Redwood City Sunrise Lions. They participated in the Redwood City Fair Oaks Festival, have had garage sales, are selling Y&CA tickets, and most recently had their first major fund raiser. The Black and White Gala Dinner and Dance had over 200 in attendance with most of those attending being residents of the area. The transformation of the church hall with decorations, pillars, table decorations, table cloths, chair coverings, etc. was truly amazing as they only have 12 members. (See pictures page 9.)

President Carmen Chong has instilled the club with a sense of purpose and vibrancy to help the club serve the Community of Fair Oaks.






Lions Clubs International recently

earned honorable recognition for its outstanding service in diabetes from the International Diabetes Federation. At the 20th World Diabetes Congress, October 19-22, in Montreal, Canada, Professor Martin Silink, 2006-2009 president of the International Diabetes Federation, presented the award to Lions Clubs International during the General Council assembly of its more than 200 member associations representing more than 160 countries. The award recognizes Lions Clubs International formally as one of the prominent global leaders in humanitarian and community services, and for its consideration for diabetes as a growing global concern.

The diabetes epidemic will affect close to 440 million by 2030 if the current trend is not addressed. On behalf of Lions Clubs International, President Eberhard Wirfs states that the association "will continue to encourage its membership to become increasingly involved with diabetes-related projects and activities in response to this growing epidemic."
