November, a month to give our thanks for the blessings bestowed upon us, our family and our friends.

We did a few Visitations this month prior to leaving for the Philippines for the 1st Lions In Sight, Free Eye Clinic in Asia. Six San Francisco clubs namely the Fil-Am, Highlands,



District Governor Esther (center in purple vest) and her entourage of 4-C4 Lions were warmly welcomed in the Philippines this past November.

Host, Marina-North Beach, Premier South San Francisco Golden Gate donated funds for this project and individual donations from PDG Jocelyn Mina, PP Mario Panoringan, RC jack Van Etten, RC Sandee Ige and ZC Kevin Kielty. Approximately, \$11,000.00 was raised. Trainers transportation, equipments and 50, 000 used eyeglasses was shipped earlier. Training of the Lions or vision screeners was provided and a certificate of completion was given after they passed the train-



ing. There were 2 days of clinic afterwards wherein about 300 patients were seen and fitted with eyeglasses. Housing and

meals were also provided to the trainers which was the responsibility of the District of DG Alex Manguba. A club was chartered co-sponsored by our District, the Dasmarinas De La Salle Medical Center Lions Club. The Free Eye Clinic is their project, they have to account for the eyeglass distribution and screening, they also provided the facilities for registration, visual acuity testing area, consultation area and dispensing and storing of the eyeglasses. Their charter president is the chancellor (Continued on page 3)


