From The District Governor Richard Keilholz

My Fellow Lions,

We are fast approaching our 2nd Cabinet Meeting to be held in Del Rio, Texas, and hosted by the Del Rio San Felipe Lions Club on Saturday, October 6, 2012. Highlights of this Cabinet Meeting will be the presentation and demonstration by C.K. Chorley representing PediaVision which is a handheld Screener that provides a new class of vision screening technology. The PediaVision will screen children as young as six months old to adulthood. U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that "Vision disability is the single most prevalent disabling condition among children." As your Governor, I will be very interested in seeing your response and interest in this demonstration.

An additional highlight at our Cabinet Meeting is having our own PID Mike Butler speak at our luncheon. As you know, PID Mike's name was unanimously approved by all sixteen Governors of MD-2 Texas to place his name on the State Ballot, this spring. At this Cabinet Meeting, PID Lion Mike is going to talk about District 2-A2 from his perspective.

This is brought home each time I get a chance to witness the fabulous work that's accomplished at the Texas Lions Camp. The enthusiasm and






