Join the Lions at the Red Lion Hotel



Beware of the Merry Pranksters on April 1st

April Fool's Day, also called All Fools' Day, is celebrated every April 1st in the United States. It's a day the many celebrate by pulling practical jokes on their colleagues and friends. The origin of this day is clouded in mystery but some speculate that it began in 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar. People who were slow to adapt to the change and celebrated the new year in a different month, became the butt of jokes and hoaxes.

In modern times, people sometimes go to great lengths to concoct stories to prank the public.

- On April 1, 2000, England's Independent ran a hoax story with the headline,
 "Scientists develop wonder pill to boost libido of sexually inadequate pets." Apparently, it was developed to put more life in old Fido.
- In 1981, the Herald-News reported that the federal government had allocated \$1.3 million dollars to release two thousand sharks into three lakes to study the breeding and habits of fresh-water sharks.
- The BBC ran a television story on the record crop of spaghetti that year. The video showed farmers harvesting spaghetti strands from trees. Several people inquired where to obtain one of the spaghetti trees.
- In 1924, the Washington Post ran a story announcing that E.J. Campbell, a beekeeper, had developed a stingless bee. Because of its gentle disposition, it would be a great playmate for children.
- Google announced in 2005, that it developed the "Google Gulp". It was a soft drink that would improve your search engine experience by increasing your intelligence.
- In 1998, Burger King took out a full-page ad announcing the release of a "Left-Handed Whopper" to enhance the dining experience of all left handed people.
- The earliest hoax, took place in London in 1698. Rumors were spread that the ritual "Washing of the Lions" would occur at the Tower of London on April 1. People showed up at the allotted time and place, only to be disappointed that there were no lions being washed.




