The good news for the 2018 tax year is the standard deduction has been increased. The bad news is that more people may not itemize which may result in less people making charitable donations as the tax savings may shrink. The good news is the estate tax exemption increases to \$22 million for couples which may mean less money left to charities from large estates. The unintended consequences of all these changes means less money going to nonprofits. This means that service organizations like the Lions Club will be more important to help close the charity gap through service and donations.

To have a bigger impact in our communities and close the service gap, our Club needs to continue to attract and retain members. 


















































Bringing the Generations Together














A Tribute to Officer Chetcuti


