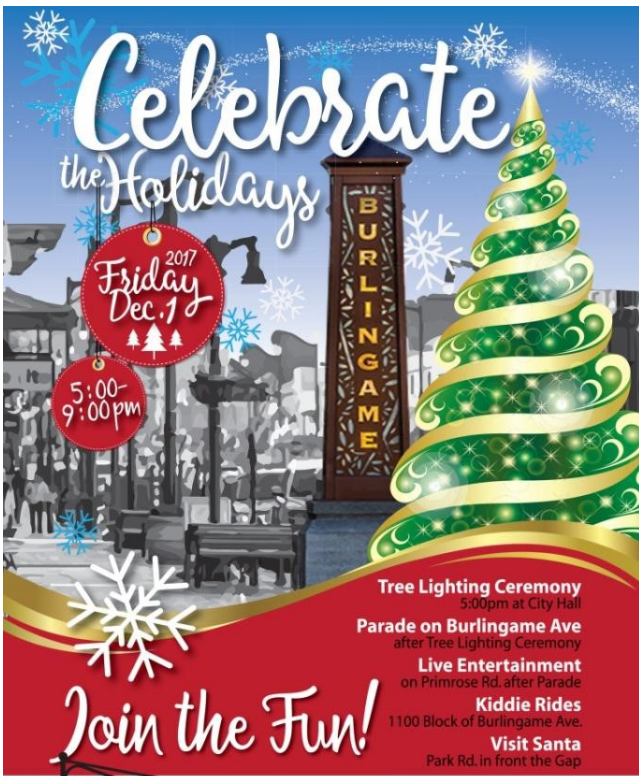
Santa “Paws” is Coming to Town

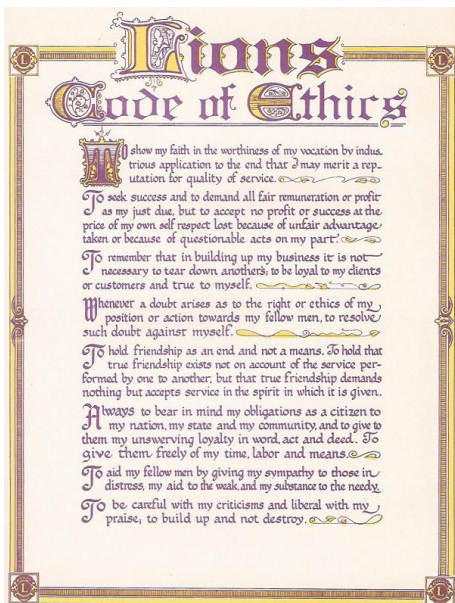

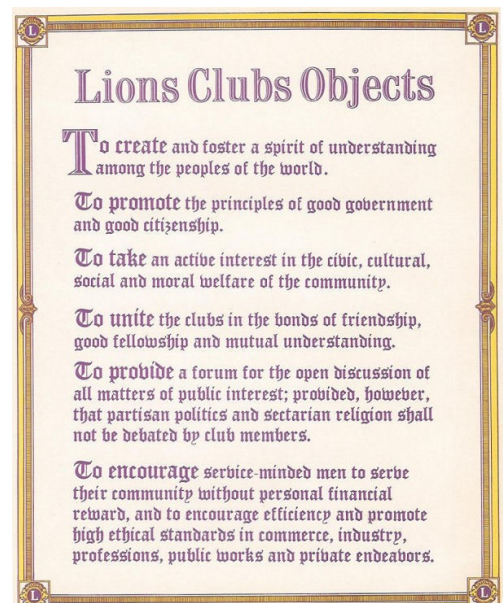
