### An Evening with Chef Brad McCulley

Lion Brad McCulley presented a tasty program on preparing poached pears, which can be used for a number of things. Depending on the preparation, they work well as desserts, appetizers, finger foods, as well as accompaniments for salads and entrees. He meticulously went over the variety of pears best suited for poaching and how to best prepare them for the intended dish. He was joined by his sous chef, Lion Margaret Glomstad. Before becoming the Burlingame City Librarian, Lion Brad spent over 10 years as a pastry chef. He graduated from the School of Culinary Arts in Atlanta, GA. From there, he worked at various establishments: Hotel Niko, Grand Hyatt, and the Country Club of the South. He spent the last two years in Atlanta as the Assistant Pastry Chef at Coke Headquarters in downtown Atlanta, Ga. He moved to the Bay Area in 2007, where he was Pastry Chef at Garibaldis in San Francisco.

At the end of the presentation, we all were invited to sample some of the pears he had prepared for the evening. We had a choice of sampling pears poached in either red or white wine. Several of the members stayed after the end of the meeting to make sure nothing went to waste.



The chance to enjoy Lion Brad's dishes brought out our members in force. Notable Lions who were in attendance were Lions Kevin Osborne, Viviana Bolivar-Crespo, Glenn Mendelson, Margaret Glomstad, and Carlus Blevins. Lions Betty and Jackie arrived after taking an Uber for a tour of Burlingame.

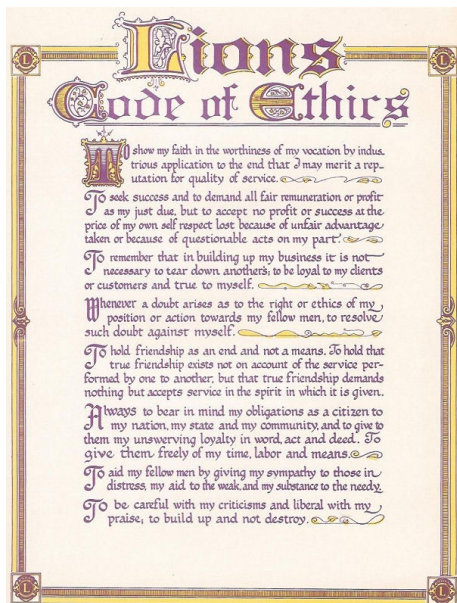

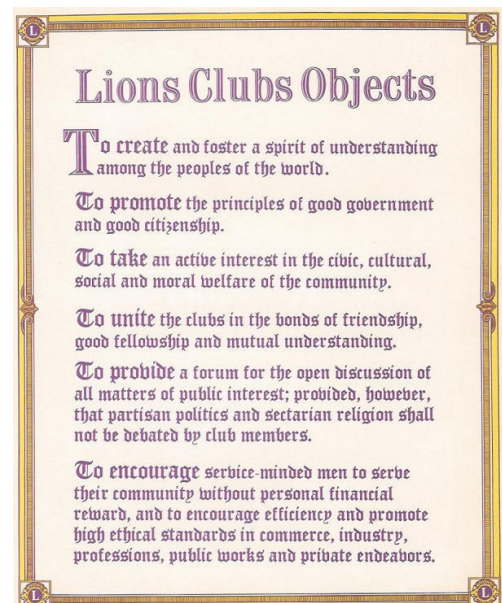

## ***Experiment and Enjoy!***

### ***Poached Pears...nectar of the Gods***

- **Poaching pears basics:**
  - Basic formula
  - peeled pears,
  - whole or halved,
  - cook in a liquid for 20-40 minutes over low to medium-low heat
- **Pear types:**
  - Bosc pear (best)
  - Anjou pear (acceptable)
  - Bartlett pear (can quickly go to mush)
- **Liquid:**
  - Liquid to sweetener ratio = about 4:1.3
  - Water
  - Red/white Wine
  - Sweet vermouth
  - Beer
  - Stock
- **Poaching Flavors:**
  - Mulling spices - cinnamon, cardamom, peppercorns, allspice, orange peel, ginger, anise, vanilla bean etc...
  - Herbs - rosemary, sage, saffron, tarragon, thyme, mint, lemon verbena
  - Tea, coffee, espresso, chai, hibiscus
  - Rum, bourbon, masala
- **Why poached pears? So damn versatil!!**
  - Kid's food
  - Breakfast with
    - pancakes
    - french toast
    - granola /yoghurt
  - Appetizer - cheese plate, savory tart (think onion/pear tart)
  - Salad - a component of a salad, a salad by itself
  - Salad dressing
  - Entree side - pork, chicken, sausage
  - Dessert or Dessert Component -- (great do-ahead), baked whole into a cake, sliced in a tart, on its own
  - Cocktails
