UPDATE: The event has been sold out. All tickets were purchased within minutes of going online.


A Presentation by the Burlingame Police Department

### President's Day is February 22, 2018

This holiday is technically called "Washington's Birthday", although in some states, it also honors the life of Abraham Lincoln. Some states do not observe the holiday: Delaware, Florida, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, No. Carolina, Rhode Island and Wisconsin.

Washington was born on February 11, 1731 under the Julian calendar. In switching to the Gregorian calendar, he needed to add 11 days and one year to be in sync with the new system. We now designate his birthday as February 22, 1732. In 1968, Congress passed the Monday Holiday Law to "provide uniform annual observances of certain legal public holidays". We now celebrate his birthday on the third Monday in February.




