The mission of PVI Meals on Wheels is to increase food security and access to nutritious food and to keep older adults and adults with disabilities well-nourished and healthy, living independently in their own homes. PVI Meals on Wheels has provided home delivered meals to San Mateo County residents since 1977.

They serve more than 100,000 meals each year.

- 54% of the seniors they serve live alone
- 20% of them have no other sources of food than the one meal PVI Meals on Wheels provides each day
- Meals are prepared in their kitchen at Little House, Menlo Park
- Their staff and volunteer drivers deliver meals and safety checks to 1,100 seniors and adults with disabilities in neighborhoods across San Mateo County.

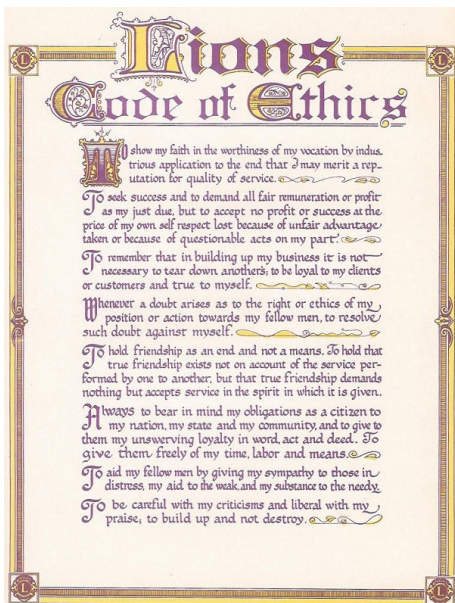

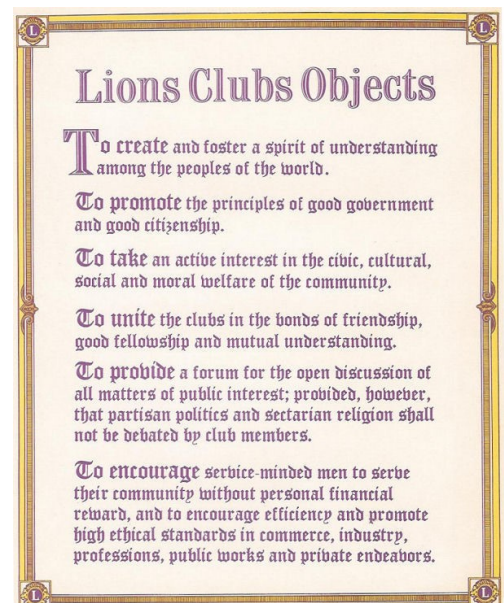
