As of last night, over 221,000 acres were effected by fires and over 3,600 people were in shelters in Northern California. Entire neighborhoods and communities have been destroyed. The last several months the United States has seen biblical level destruction. On Facebook, residences of Burlingame are sharing pictures of uncles, parents, brothers, sisters, and close friends whose lives and homes have been ravaged by the wildfires. The iconic residence of Charles Schultz was consumed by fire; however, his wife escaped safely. Thirty-four have been confirmed dead and hundreds are still missing.

These events remind us how fragile and valuable our lives and communities are. It's a good time to reassess your emergency preparedness and readiness. I was watching a Ring video (i.e. front door camera you can buy at Costco) of a St. Catherine parent that showed his house motion detector camera being triggered at 4 am on Monday. It displayed a bright fire lit sky in the near distance. Then at 4:20 am the camera captured part of his house structure catching fire. Then at 4:30 am the camera went blank as the whole house was engulfed in flames. That's about three snoozes on an alarm clock. For those who are procrastinating your emergency preparedness please do it now. May you, your family, and friends be safe and prepared. May God bless those effected by the fires and disasters around the world.

At our Thursday luncheon, the members will discuss what are ways within our constraints and resources the Burlingame Lions can help the fire victims. Also, this Thursday our speaker is the Director of CALL Primrose, Terri Boesch. She will present an overview of the needs and projects of CALL Primrose. I look forward to seeing everyone at our luncheon.

If Game of Thrones is more to your taste, you might enjoy a visit from a White Walker.






If heroes are more to your liking, you might enjoy someone from Guardians of the Galaxy. Rocket, Drax, Gamora, Groot or Star-Lord.

Wonder Woman is a long time favorite. She's back fighting evil...and winning.






If beauty and charming comes to mind, then a costume from Beauty and the Beast will make your day

The month of October is important to Lions around the world for it honors a commitment made to Helen Keller in 1925. She attended the Lions Club International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio, and challenged the Lions to become "Knights of the Blind in the crusade against darkness." The Lions had already been involved in helping those with visual disabilities prior to this event, but the challenge was taken to heart and preserving sight became an integral part of every Lions Club.

The development of the white cane for people with severe visual loss came out of the Peoria Lions Club. Lion George Bonham helped to develop the white cane with a red tip to assist the blind in independent mobility. October 15th is White Cane Safety Day. It is a day to increase awareness of those who use the white cane:

- Signifies that the pedestrian using it is blind or visually impaired
- Alerts motorists of the need to exercise special caution and provide the user the right of way
- Symbolizes the independence, confidence and skills of the person who is using it


