





Bike4Vets Program

On November 18, 2017, the Annual Bikes4Vets program gave out 88 reconditioned bikes to veterans in San Francisco, San Mateo County and, beginning with this year, a trailer-load of bikes were delivered to the veteran patients in Martinez. The bikes were provided by the SFPD, reconditioned by volunteers with new parts including brakes, bike locks, helmets and lights; each recipient was required to take a course in bike safety before provided their bike. Sponsors of the project were the San Francisco Veteran Lions, South of Market Rotarians, the San Francisco Police Department, Lions Veterans Charities Inc., and many others including donations from Lions, Rotarians, businesses, and the public. This annual project was directed by Lion Helen Wong, Rotarian Nine La Dow, and Officer Padmore of the SFPD.


