

A Special Time not to be forgotten. Down syndrome, also known as trisomy 21, is a genetic disorder caused by the presence of all or part of third copy of chromosome 21. It is typically, character associated with physical growth delays, characteristic facial features and mild to moderate intellectual disability. The average IQ of an adult with Down syndrome is 50, equivalent to the mental ability of 8 or 9-year old but, this can vary widely.

A group of parents and their Down syndrome children from Foster City were presented by the Mayor of Foster City Charlie Bronitsky. It was declared that this month in Foster City would be observed as the Down syndrome month.

There is no cure for Down syndrome. Education and proper care have shown to improve the quality of life for them. Life expectancy is around 50 to 60.
