Club Board Approves SPOT Vision Screener for up to \$7,800 At our Club Board meeting on November 13th the Club Board discussed two options, participate in District 4-C4 LCIF Grant request or provide 100% of the SPOT machine purchase from Club funds. Jim Bigelow provided a summary of his efforts to get three Lions Clubs to each fund \$3,750 and proceed with a District Grant to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) but as of the Second District Cabinet meeting in early November only two Clubs had committed to the funding after about six months of trying. The other option was for our Club to move ahead and buy our own SPOT Vision Screener and we would have full control over its use and scheduling. The cost of our SPOT machine excluding the printer was \$7,383.04.

It was further reported that the District SPOT machine we have been using was not working properly for the last day of school screening by our Club and it will need to be rescheduled. After additional input from our Club ICARE Committee Co-Chairs Bobbie McDonald and Tina Morris their recommendation was that our Club purchase our own SPOT machine. District 4-C4 officials PDG Esther Lee, District LCIF Liaison and District Treasurer Dr. Jun Valera coordinated with our Club Treasurer Priscilla Robertson on the purchase details. The SPOT machine and its attachments arrived Thanksgiving week and our ICARE Co-Chairs are getting a printer and will have the new machine ready for our Club December scheduled school vision screening. The ICARE Committee members and Club members as of Thanksgiving have donated over \$4,000 towards the purchase of the new SPOT machine and we very much appreciate their support so we could make this purchase.

Jim Bigelow will continue to assist the District in getting the local match for the District LCIF SPOT machine grant. The remaining donations needed from the District Club's are \$3,250.00. It is hoped that this final amount will be secured by the middle of December so the Grant can be submitted after DG Mario Benavente signs the request. If all goes well this will expand our District vision screening capability to meet the growing number of requests within our District.
