To support LCIF with its many humanitarian efforts, our Club made two donations @ \$2000: 9/21/17: in response to the hurricanes/flooding/earthquakes around the world which took place in September.

10/19/17: designated for "Fire Disaster Relief in District 4-C2".

On the weekend of 9/30-10/1/17, our Club held its annual White Cane Day Event during the Moon Festival Celebration in San Francisco Chinatown, under the leadership of Lion 1st VP Sandy Su. We had over 20 Lions, Leos and 2017 Teen Scholarship Gala participants canvasing the street audience as well as appearing on stage to promote Lionism and donations. We collected \$2383.15 in donations.

On 10/14/17, our Club partnered with NorthEast Medical Services (NEMS) to provide eye screening and consultation for adults and children during the annual San Francisco Chinatown Health Fair, under the leadership of SF Chinatown/Vision Care Service Foundation Lion Chair Helen Hui. 15 SFCLC Lions participated and Lions trained in the use of the Plus Optix screened approximately 25 children. And on 10/31/17, 6 SFCLC Lions screened 37 children who attended a Halloween Party hosted by SF Asian Women's Resource Center. Prior to these events, PDG Larry Wong and PCC Emil Kantola conducted a demonstration and training with SFCLC Lions on the use of the Plus Optix Vision Screener and Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screener.

At the October 19th General Club Meeting, District 4-C4 Governor Mario Benavente inducted three new members: Joseph Chan, Mia Hue and Lei David Wang. The solemn ceremony had a light hearted moment when the new members were required to drink a glass of milk to symbolize feeding the Baby Lion. The 3 members competed with each other as to who would finish first. We look forward to inducting additional new members in future meetings.

At the same Oct. 19th meeting, DG Mario was accompanied by 3 Cabinet members: 1st Vice District Governor Lydia Taylor-Bellinger, Region One Chair John Hui and Region 1 Zone 1 Chair Margaret Lee (our Club's very own Lion Margaret). DG Lion Mario, 1st VDG Lion Lydia and Region One Chair Lion John gave informative and Lion-spirited talks to energize everyone. It was a most meaningful and fun evening enjoyed by all. A big thank you to DG Lion Mario and his Cabinet Team for their visit.

During the month of October, under the guidance of Board Director Lion Ning Ho, contacts were made with schools to inform and to solicit participation in the Peace Poster Contest. 



- To Show my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.
- To Seek success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.
- To Remember that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.
- Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.
- To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.
- Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.
- To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.
- To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

Lions Clubs International Purpose

- To Organize, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.
- **To Coordinate** the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.
- **To Create** and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.
- **To Promote** the principles of good government and good citizenship.
