Introducing Lions International President Gudrun Bjort Yngvadottir – Part 1

She's made history by being the first woman international president of the Lions Clubs International (LCI), and it's easy to remember her name because it's one of the most common names in her native Iceland.

Gudrun Bjort Yngvadottir was named after her mother's sister who died just weeks before she was born in 1948. "She was very dear to my mother, so she decided to give me the same name as my aunt," says Yngvadottir during our interview in Petaling Jaya, Selangor.

In fact, a 2004 survey ranked Gudrun as the most given female name (followed by Anna and Sigriour) because of Iceland's strong tradition of parents using the names of those close to them for their children. "I have four granddaughters and two of them have my name too," Yngvadottir confirms.



The charming 70-year-old now heads the traditionally male-oriented LCI, an international non-political service organization based in Illinois, United States. It was founded by Melvin Jones in 1917 and became the first service club to finally admit women as members in 1987.

There are now 1.4 million members in over 200 countries, and in July this year Yngvadottir was elected as their first woman international president during the 101st international convention in Las Vegas.

Yngvadottir, a biomedical scientist and former vice director of the Institute of Continuing Education at the University of Iceland, has been a member of the Gardabaejar Eik Lions Club since 1992. She has dedicated her service to children and youths, leadership development, environmental protection, health and wellness, and the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

Between 2010 and 2014, she was international director (then chairperson) on the leadership committee, she was on the women's task force, she was a board appointee on the district and clubs service committee, and on the LCIF governance ad hoc committee.

Her awards in recognition of her services include the Kjarans Medal from the Icelandic Lions, the Lions Crystal from the Norwegian Lions, 11 International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Goodwill Award (the highest LCI honor).

Yngvadottir's rise to the top of the pride was systematic. Over the years, she served actively and worked her way up the ranks. In 2016, she became VP and took time off from her day job (and earning a professional salary) to focus on her volunteer work. "I don't know if I'm going back. You leave everything for this. It's a six-year commitment and I have to give myself 100%," she says.

The reopening of the 2018 District 4-C4 Convention has been called by the 2018-2019 District 4-C4 Cabinet for August 8, 2018. The reopening of the Convention is being call to vote to endorse a candidate for International Director from our District, 4-C4, only.

All delegates must register and be certified between 6:00pm and 7:30pm on Wednesday, August 8, 2018. The number of certified delegates will be announced at 7:30pm and voting will begin. Voting will be permitted until 8:30pm. No certification is permitted during the vote.

Voting results will be announced at 8:45pm.



The California Lions Foundation (CLF) is growing and being responsive to the needs of California Lions clubs. CLF now has about \$170,000 in its accounts. This includes charities/activities and administrative funds, as well as designated donations. CLF is well on its way to the established funding goal of \$250,000 in order to begin providing grants to California Lions clubs, which should commence in the 2018-2019 Lions year. Recently CLF has responded to the spate of serious fires in our state by accepting designated donations to help provide wildfire relief.

CLF wishes to again acknowledge the outstanding support of about 85 individual Lions and nine Clubs and Districts for becoming 'Founding Members' of CLF. CLF also has received one corporate donation for \$5,000. The CLF Board is expanding efforts to obtain additional corporate and company support. Nonetheless, our biggest challenge remains getting the word out to all California Lions clubs on all the opportunities to donate and on the benefits CLF can bring to California communities through its Lions clubs.



CLF also generated \$12,280 in gross receipts from the pendant raffle held July 1st in Las Vegas. The lucky winner was Lion Josephine Louie from the Los Angeles Envision Lions Club. Thanks to all the Lions who participated in this necessary administrative fundraiser and special heartfelt thanks to PDG Alberto Montes de Oca for donating his time, talent and ALL materials that went into the pendant.

As you know, the California Lions Foundation (CLF) was created to provide matching grants to California Lions Clubs for humanitarian, vision, environmental, disaster relief, and other projects to better serve our California communities. These matching financial grants will be available to clubs and districts to meet various needs and projects in their respective communities. The dollar range of CLF grants will be focused on projects from \$500 to \$10,000 which do not qualify for support from other Lions foundations. A CLF grant will also be able to be combined with a LCIF grant for larger projects.

CLF is a great vehicle to help to Lions Clubs meet our community needs in California. All donations to CLF will be provided back to the Lions Clubs of California as matching project grants or as restricted charity project funds. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, CLF can also accept dedicated tax-deductible donations for charity projects of individual Lions Clubs approved in advance by CLF. CLF then provides the designated donations back to the club for use on their approved project.

FOSTER CITY LIONS TAKE VETERANS FISHING

On August 9, three members of the local Lions took veterans from the three VA Hospitals, at Palo Alto, Menlo Park and Ft. Miley, San Francisco, on their annual Veterans' Fishing Trip. By charter of the entire boat, the Lovely Martha docked at Fisherman's Wharf, the Lions accompanied the maximum number of veterans; they left the dockside at Jefferson Street at 5:30AM and headed out the Gate, first to fish the deep water arrival channel west of the Bay entrance, then headed north to the Marin County coastside off of Stinson Beach where, they started getting strikes from a constant action of large and heavy bodied King Salmon! The salmon were feeding on Krill, a tiny shrimplike food, upwelling from the rich seabed, which then caused the Salmon to grow in size and weight including maturing roe and increased stamina for the long journey through the Bay, the Delta then to the upper reaches of the Sacramento River, to hopefully spawn and start the next generation of King/Chinook Salmon.



This fishing trip is the continuing of annual trips for veterans, this being the twentieth continuous year of taking veterans out of their daily events at the VA Hospitals; thanks to the generosity of Lions' fund raising and individual contributions; The August 9 trip is actually the second of now two annual fishing trips, due to the generosity of Foster City resident Don Isaacs, and is also in conjunction with eight other annual continuing veterans' projects, including yet another fishing program will be started: Disabled Veterans from the VA Hospitals will be bussed to a regional lake organized to fish at the lakeside or fish in pontoon boats suitable for disabled individuals. Unfortunately, due to fire dangers in hills and forests of many lakes and reservoirs, the first outing has been postponed until hopefully this Fall.
