Northern California Wildfires and Lions Disaster Assistance As we are all aware the Redding Area Capps and Mendocino Wildfires were two of the largest fires covering several hundred thousand acres and displacing thousands of residents. All of the Lions Clubs in California were asked to consider making cash donations to help local Lions Districts in the disaster areas to help provide relief from the Lions to this tragedy. Our Club made donations to Redding Lions District 4-C1 and to Lions Clubs International Foundation Northern Wildfire Relief.

Sunday Farmers Market As of the beginning of September our Club sponsored Sunday Farmers Market in downtown continues with over \$1,100 gross income from fees paid by our farmers and vendors. We also in recent weeks have sustained 1,000 or more pounds per Sunday of donated produce and this produce goes to needy non-profits. It is anticipated that this level of produce donations should continue through October. With these levels of donated produce we continue to be challenged to have enough empty boxes to put the donated produce in for pickup by the non-profits. Any help those can provide to meet this challenge you efforts will be much appreciated.

ICARE Vision Screening Activities Bobbie McDonald and Tina Morris are beginning the SPOT machine vision screening scheduling with the local schools that begins in October and traditionally ends around June. For now the vision screening will be in full swing the first full week of each month. There may be other vision screening opportunities that will become available during this Fiscal year. In the latter part of September the Committee will gather for a coordination meeting to begin the vision screening season and provide additional training as needed on the SPOT vision screening equipment. We appreciate the efforts of the Screening Committee and look forward to another productive year for our local school children and others.

Last Fiscal year ending June 30th the LensCrafters Special Program ended for eye exams and glasses. For our new Fiscal year Club President John Hickson along with Bobbie and Tina will look into new opportunities to provide these services and our Sight Budget for this Fiscal year is \$3,000 and make recommendations to our Club Board.
