COUNTY HEALTH ORDER MANDATORY SHELTER IN PLACE

San Mateo County is currently under a MANDATORY shelter-in-place health order issued to reduce the spread of the Coronavirus You are **REQUIRED** to stay home except for essential needs, and you should maintain social distancing (keeping at least 6 feet of physical distance between people) when in public. Gatherings are prohibited, and restrictions are in place at our parks.

We can reduce the spread of the coronavirus and save lives if everyone helps to cooperate right now.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?



(COVID-19).

EVERYONE must stay home except to get food, care for a relative or friend, get necessary health care, or go to an essential job.



IT IS OK to go on walks in your neighborhood. Only visit parks or recreation areas that you can walk or bike to. Parks are for passive use only.



ESSENTIAL local government functions will continue, including first responders and law enforcement.



DO NOT gather with others. No visitors or meeting up with friends. Bars, nightclubs, and gyms are closed.



DO NOT drive or take public transit to recreation areas. Parking and restroom access may be limited.



NO TEAM SPORTS or pick-up games are allowed. City park playgrounds, fields and courts are closed. Do not congregate.

IMPORTANT: If you are an older adult or have a serious chronic medical condition, you are especially vulnerable and should **STAY HOME**.
