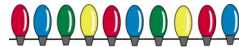

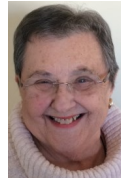

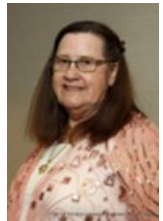

# Daly City Host Lions Recycling Opportunities



**Don Riker Recycling Fund**—Bring your cans and bottles to the second meeting each month or contact Lion Ed Dollard to arrange pick up. Turn in at your local recycling center and donate the money to the fund.

**Bread Tags for Wheelchairs**— Don't throw the little plastic tag from your bread bags away – bring them to Lion Secretary Denise Kelly. The Leos in District 4-C4 are collecting them for *Danielle Cares for Chairs* (an organization recycling bread tags for the purchase of wheelchairs).

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

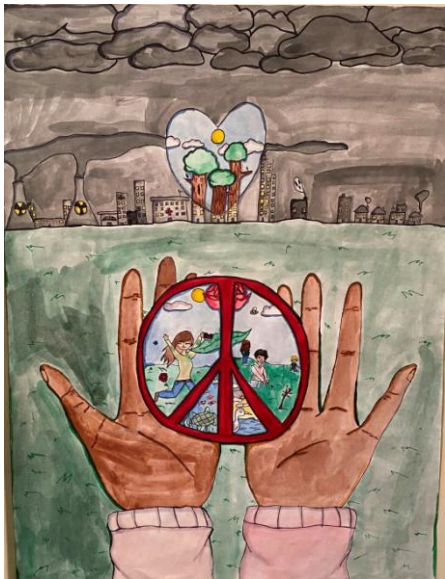

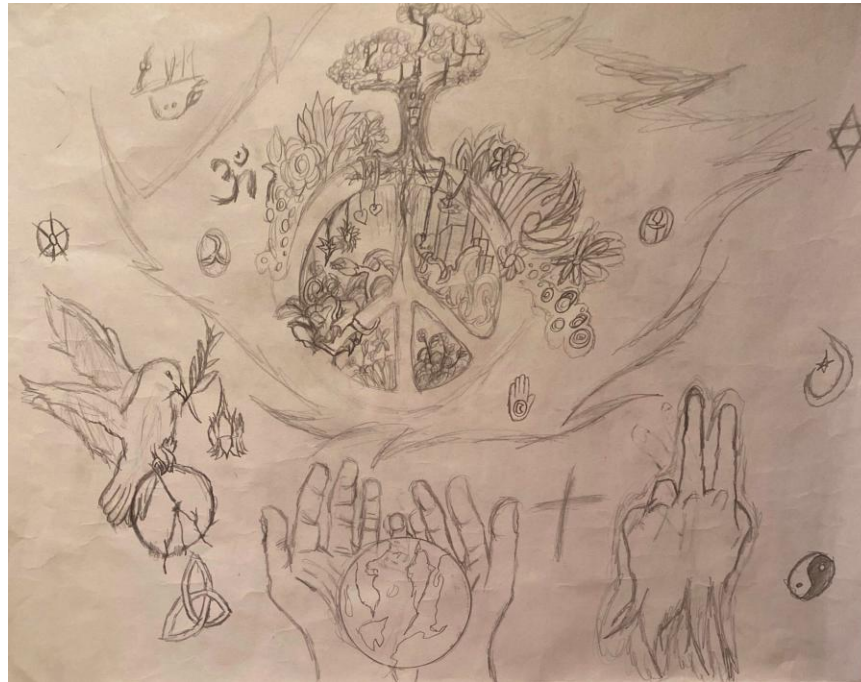
