

# Daly City Host Lions Recycling Opportunities





**OUTSTANDING ACTIVITIES**

**1941-1952** (no recording of activities)

**1953-1956**

The safety committee distributed 5000 California Vehicle code summaries in a drive safety campaign. The club took necessary steps to have tall weeds constituting a traffic hazard, removed from the San Pedro and Juniper Serra Blvd. Junction by our community Betterment Committee. Club held annual picnic and barbecue for members and friends. Held a dance and made a net profit of \$1000. Delivered twelve Christmas packages to needy families total of 68 children at a cost of the club \$409. A donkey basket ball game was held at Jefferson Union High School between members of Daly-

**1953-1956**

The Daly City Colma LC and High School faculty to raise funds for athletic equipment for school \$200 was raised. The Daly City-Colma LC along with four other L C Raised money to save the Girls Scout Camp from foreclosure. Approximately \$12,000.00 was raised. Club took sponsorship of Boys Scout Troop. Club contributed \$30 to the Girls Scout annual cookie sale. Purchased 6 tickets for Daly City Community Concert, given to under privileged students, high school. Club sent eleven girls to summer camp at a cost of \$255. Held their annual boys and girls fishing day at Lake Merced. The members transported to and from the lake approximately 150 children, rods and lines were supplied to those who did not have their own. Lions supplied sandwiches, milk, and ice cream. Held annual picnic for members and friends. at a cost of \$300. The safety committee supported the teamster Green Cross Safety crusade obtained pledges from the members and distributed bumper stickers. The club distributed eight Christmas baskets to needy families at a cost of twenty-five dollars per baskets. Contributed \$25 to Safe Driving Day. Purchased glasses and eye examinations for five underprivileged students. Club participated in donation of toys to Yuba City children deprived of their regular Christmas due to a flood. Club donated \$46 to the James Walton family fund, who was burned out of their home.

**1957-1964**

The club presented Lion Stanford Hannah, retiring Superintendent of Jefferson Union High School, with a watch for this outstanding administering to the youth of the city, for the past twelve years. The club paid for eye exam and purchased pair of glasses for underprivileged child. Club held there annual fishing day for the boys and girls 200 children attended. This project has been one of the favorites. Club had annual picnic entertained their wives and friends to a barbecue steak dinner. Club had white cane day and money will be used for the Blind and Sight Conservation. Four members contributed considerable amount of time in support of United Crusade. The annual youth welfare dance was held approximately 400 teenagers and 150 adults attended. The club assisted the Boys Scouts in selling Christmas wreaths. Polio day was held at the Daly City Super Service Station five cents on every gallon of gas pumped was donated to the Polio Fund, which

amounted to \$55. The club was instrumental in obtaining 500 booklets entitled "How do you measure up in the job of being a safe driver" the safety committee turned booklets over to Jefferson Union High School adult training to be used for their driver training program. Club had fourth annual Youth Art Contest and over 1000 exhibits from grammar and high school areas submitted. The show was open to the public over 10,000 people attended over a five period day. Contributed \$51 to the Klutch Kings LC to enable to get their national charter. A local teenager was struck by car seriously injured the driver had in insurance the club collected money for the family. A man and wife both blind, a one year old baby girls with normal vision and blind friend lived in a home in a run down condition, members cleaned the entire contents of the home, painted every room, washed and waxed all floors, cleaned the furniture, and had the bedding cleaned.

#### **1957-1964**

Polio Day was held again for the tenth year, five cents on every gallon pumped was donated the polio fund. The club name was changed from Daly City Colma to Daly City Host. Club had a light bulb sale. Club continues to send out Christmas baskets to needy families. Club paid for two children's eyeglasses. Paid for one week at summer camp for a blind child. White Cane netted \$625. Donated \$25 to San Raefel School for dogs for the blind. Donated to Guide Dogs for the blind \$25 and Enchanted Hills Camp \$50. Six members painted the interior of a home for a deserving family. Club entered a float in the parade. White cane day netted approximately \$350. A donation of \$300 to Jefferson High School Glee club. A donation of \$200 to operations Santa Claus to take care of approximately twelve deserving families with Christmas baskets. Purchased one lens for eyeglasses for elementary student. Made a donation of \$50 to the California League for Handicapped Inc. Sent 19 year old mentally handicapped boy to summer camp for two weeks. Purchased from the Jefferson Elementary School 17,000 book as at nominal fee. Books donated to a religious organization that in turn will send them to underprivileged areas, to help combat illiteracy. Held annual fishing day approximately 210 children attended. Sent a check of \$25 to the San Mateo County Council on Alcoholism, Inc. Donation of \$25 for Welfare Fund to National Cystic Fibrosis research foundation. Had a white cane drive and profited \$865. Club supplied ambulance service or sedan service to those needing transportation to the polio centers for their vaccine. Club made Christmas contribution to Lighthouse for the Blind \$50. Operation Santa Claus collected \$200 towards Christmas baskets for the needy families. A donation of \$100 made to California League for the handicapped, Inc. to help in providing recreation, training in self care, work experience, camping, parent counseling and community education. A donation of \$100 to Westmore H S to assist in their Youth Exchange Weibel. Youth Art Exhibit was held hundreds of exhibits were viewed by thousands of people. It was a huge success. A Braillewriter was purchased for a blind sixth grade girl at the cost of \$80. A donation of \$100 was given to Half Moon Bay Club to be used to breed and raise dogs to be trained as guide dog for the blind. Lion eye Foundation \$100 donated. Held annual fishing day one hundred and forty children participated. Club donated a complete Bible in Braille the Daly City Public Library. Had a successful White Cane drive netted \$804. Operation Santa Claus making up & distributing of Christmas packages, groceries, clothing & toys to deserving families. Club sponsored a bowling team and Boys Scout Club. The club paid one month's rent, provided large box of groceries and purchased two pairs of shoes for a family. The father was confined to hospital and the mother was bed ridden. The boy was unable to go to school for lack of shoes. The club participated in Youth & Welfare Project fund raising activity and netted \$1446. Donated \$100 the experiment in International Living a foreign student exchange program sponsored by Westmoor H S. Contributed \$150 to the Jung Sook Kim Fund to educate a blind Korean girl in this country.

#### **1968-1975**

A donation of \$100 was made to explorer post #817. A donation of \$150 to Westmoor H S Band. Soccer game tickets were donated to Oak Knoll Hospital cost to the club \$187. Club donated \$100 to the Daly City Police Athletic League. Club held biannual art show in which 750 students participated. Approximately 3,500 people viewed the exhibit. The club donated \$200 to the North San Mateo Co. College Community Fund Campaign. First annual Easter baseball tournament eight schools participated. A donation of \$25 for the mentally impaired and \$25 to Westmoor music boosters. The Sky Lions along with Daly City Host co-sponsored a Reno night to supplement the District convention fund. A donation to... Boy Scout Explorer \$310, Boy Scout Troop, \$68 and Pop Warner Athletic Club \$110. Donated to the Mississippi Lions disaster fund

\$100. The club purchased ½ page ad in the Pop Warner Daly city Flyers program. The white cane fund netted \$1,300. A donation of \$75 to San Francisco Light House for the Blind. The club sponsored the Brownie Girl Scout Troop. A pledge of \$300 was donated to the Police Athletic League. The club participated in the Youth & Welfare drive and profited \$1,055. The club held a fun night to raise monies for the convention funds the net profit was \$225. The Daly City police athletic league given \$200. The club participated in a fireworks stand netting \$3,300. A \$100 donation given to Daly City Bronco baseball team. The Lioness sold white canes and took in \$900. Donated \$800 to the Lions Eyes Foundation. Club purchased four eye exams for students at a cost of \$105. The boy scouts troop donated \$75. Made a donation \$538 to Jefferson H S. band. Gave the Lions Better Youth Association a check for \$1040. Held annual club barbecue which was a high success. The white cane day drive collected \$550 approximately 50% of club participated. Held breakfast with Santa 323 children were served breakfast. A \$300 check was presented to Operation Santa Claus. A donation of \$2,2000 given to Daly City Library System for visual aid library for the partially sighted. Club purchased twelve tents for Boy Scout Troop. The Easter baseball tournament was held. Wallets were given to the graduating class of the "Glenwood Camp for Boys" at a cost to the club \$60. A fireman with badly injured arm \$100 donated to the Torres Fund.

A donation of \$50 to CARE. A fund raising firework stand profited \$4000. A donation to.... Daly City Police \$50, Explorer Post Scout Troop \$50, and club netted over \$950 on the white cane drive. Donation of \$350 toward Operation Santa Claus. The Jefferson

H S annual presidential classroom tuition \$225. Reno fund raising netted \$700.
