The 411 on the PCL Meetings By: Lion John

In my mom's recent conversations with members at our meetings, she was of the thinking that we all need to go to the PCL meetings. This article will shed some light about the PCL meetings.

On June 20, my mom and I attended the PCL Board meeting, held at the PCL President's office in San Mateo. As I was originally told we'd be stuffing envelopes for the PCL Installation, I was looking forward to the service project, but it was just a normal board meeting.

The PCL has two types of meetings any Lion can attend: 1) the General Meeting that is held at the venue of the choice of the hosting club, costs \$30 and includes dinner. This is the meeting where clubs give their reports about upcoming events and District officers share updates about their activities. At a typical meeting, about 17-20 of the 25 clubs the PCL represents, will be in attendance with a total attendance of about 40-60 Lions, depending on the venue. 2) the Board Meeting that is the PCL officers meeting and is free to attend. At this meeting, the officers may discuss planning of the Police & Fire Awards Banquet, the general meeting agenda, and other PCL business. It is typically only attended by the officers and Lions who have business with the board.

The PCL Bylaws clearly state, "Any Lion can attend the PCL board meeting." As I have an attendance streak dating back to when I was our club president and I am a past president of the PCL, I wanted to add one board meeting visit each year as I pursue 10 years of perfect attendance. My goal is to get to 10 years perfect on general meetings, 9 years on attending the PCL board meeting at least once a year. I love PCL.

It's optional for any member to attend these meetings, though club presidents or their representatives are expected to attend the General Meeting. The reason why is that the club President is a member of the Council. The club can have a club representative substitute for the club president. In the PCL, for voting, each club only gets 1 vote, by either the club president or club rep. When past president Ron Borland was our club president, Lion Michael Chan was our PCL Representative. Lion Michael attended the meetings instead of Ron. I was asked by Lion Sabrina to be our PCL Rep for next season.

The PCL General Meeting is ideal for meeting other Lions in the District and for promoting our club events to a District audience. The PCL Board Meeting is ideal for learning about service on the PCL board.
