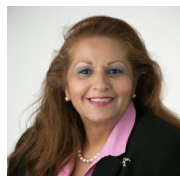

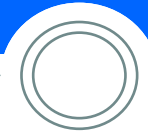

Daly City Host Lions Recycling Opportunities



Don Riker Recycling Fund—Bring your cans and bottles to the second meeting each month or contact Lion Ed Dollard to arrange pick up. Turn in at your local recycling center and donate the money to the fund.

Bread Tags for Wheelchairs— Don't throw the little plastic tag from your bread bags away – bring them to Lion Secretary Denise Kelly. The Leos in District 4-C4 are collecting them for *Danielle Cares for Chairs* (an organization recycling bread tags for the purchase of wheelchairs).
