Our ICARE Committee continues to check on the status as to when our SPOT Vision Screening for young children can be restarted. In the meantime our Sunday Farmers Market continues as an "Essential Business" serving our local community providing a vital service making available fresh produce to our community. Some ICARE Committee members are helping needy persons with eye exams and glasses through our local LensCrafters store in Menlo Park as a Club project.

<u>Club Student Speaker Contest</u> On March 4<sup>th</sup> our Club cancelled our Student Speakers Contest at Mahany Hall in San Carlos set for Saturday, March 13<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 pm. All was set to hold the Contest as an "in person" Contest but concern was expressed about the COVID-19 exposure from student participants. We had arranged for a 200 seat multipurpose room and set a limit of 10 persons attending including the Student Speakers to address COVID-19 safety measures. Some higher level contests are planned to be "in

person" so it would not appear this would work if our Club Contest Winner were to advance and again be concerned with possible COVID-19 exposure issues. It is hoped that this will not be an issue next year for the Student Speakers Contest. We understand the concerns express to us by our Student Speakers.

District 4-C4 Third Cabinet meeting Saturday, February 6<sup>th</sup> At the ZOOM Third Cabinet meeting those running for key District leadership positions were identified.
