### REJUVENATE – REVITALIZE – REMOTIVATE

Governor Teams please encourage Lions & Leos to participate in CA Lions Care Food Collection project with non-perishable food.

Food insecurity for many has always been right in front of us but somewhat hidden. We could not see the depth of the many families suffering from hunger. Not so today. The Pandemic has put the challenge front and center and the Media has succeeded in showing us the long lines of people in need.

As Lions and Leos, we can serve this need in so many ways. Our committee will hold three workshops to describe in detail the many ways we can take on the challenge and not burn out your Lions club members. Join us on February 22, March 22, & April 12 at 6:30 pm on Zoom. See the link attached.

At our workshops we will cover the following ways to accomplish feeding thousands to tens of thousand's people according to the need in your area. We will also ask you to share what your clubs are already doing to solve the problem.

1. You can work with Farmers of all kinds to deliver their excess food to food pantries in your club's name.
2. A list of farmers of all kinds will be sent to you once you register for the workshop or you can find it on the Multiple websites.
3. All food pantries for the most part will work with clubs to box food for you to deliver to the homeless, the poor, those living in their cars, those living in shelters, and to senior, people with disabilities, and Veterans.
4. Companies such as, "Farm Fresh to You" will partner with you for a small donation or purchase to deliver Fresh Organic boxes filled with all foods for the underserved, or your friends or your own families and your club will earn a percentage of the purchase. We are talking, boxes filled with milk, eggs, meat, chicken, canned goods, veggies, fruit, nuts. You will not want to miss hearing about this opportunity.

5. Power Growers around California produce 8X more food using 90% less water and have Zero carbon footprint. The food is organic and Power Growers support Lions in feeding people. We will tell you how to work with them to deliver food.
6. You can work with your local restaurants who will discount food for the hungry and you can deliver hot food where needed.
7. Canned food manufacturers such as Del Monte have a special deal for service organizations to work with their distributors to give away tons of food.
8. UNICEF will supply Lions with discounted food for the starving children and adults, Nationally and Internationally. This food is special food for starving people who can no longer digest whole food due to lack of food for an extended period. The food is organic and does not need to be mixed with water that is sometimes contaminated or will mold the food. It is called "Plumpy Nut".
9. You can also donate funds or equipment to your local food banks.

There are 12 more ways that we will feature at our workshops to support your "Hunger projects". There are also LCIF Pilot Hunger Grants and 24 secular grants that we will also discuss and give you access to.

We have already been in touch with many District Governors and or Lions Clubs Hunger Chairs and we would very much like to work with all club and support your ongoing hunger projects as well as assist you in starting new projects.

One club has already delivered over three million pounds of food of all kinds that has fed thousands. Other clubs have been extremely creative, and they also fed thousands. Join us and find out who these clubs are and how they do it.

### LEO'S CORNER: NEW PARK BENCH UPDATE

The Leo's asked – and Millbrae answered, in an enormous way! In just the 6th week of a 6 month project, the Leo's have collected/sorted/weighed/submitted/reported over 550 pounds of recyclable plastic, 10% over the entire goal and are now in the process of ordering the new park bench for Millbrae! The bench is expected to be delivered in the next 10-12 weeks from Trex (the company sponsoring the event), and the Leo's will be coordinating the next steps with Millbrae's Department of Public Works to help arrange for the site selection and installation.

The project has generated a huge amount of interest, support, and community involvement. Many Millbrae citizens have implored the Leo's to continue their effort – and, this afternoon (3/14), the Leo's Board met and decided that not only will they continue their own project, but they are going to expand their involvement by mentoring other youth groups in Millbrae to help them get their own 'Plastic into a Park Bench' projects launched – and the Leo's will share the plastic they are bringing in with other groups! First on deck is the Millbrae Daisies/Girl Scouts, the Leo's will be meeting with the 5-6 year old Daisies and the 10-11 year old Girls Scouts of Millbrae later this month on March 28 – to describe the program and demonstrate how to manage the plastic (sifting/sorting/weighing/submitting/reporting). The Leo's will be assisting the youngsters with logistics and encouragement in ensuring they have a successful program!

Below are pictures from the 'emergency' work-party on Wednesday afternoon, March 10 – when there was SO much plastic at City Hall that an unscheduled event had to be convened. Over 160 pounds was processed and delivered to the loading dock @ Millbrae Safeway (another shout out to Safeway Store Management/Directors Simo Elomari and Ryan Bain – they made themselves readily available to us AGAIN in supporting Millbrae and the Leo's!) We also need to call out City Employees Eduardo Gonzalez, Craig Centis, and City Manager Tom Williams who also helped with the efforts! Then yesterday, Saturday March 13 – ANOTHER 170+ pounds was processed by the Leo's at Millbrae City Hall!
