Fourth, the creation of District Membership Growth and New Club Development Award AKA as PDG Macy Mak Chan and PDG Rod Mercado

Award. During the third Cabinet meeting, Lion Cindy Zheng, the club organizer of the San Francisco Global Health Care Cyber Lions Club was given the New Club Development Award. Other awards include: Membership Growth, First Place- San Mateo Metropolitan Lions Club, Second Place- SF Unified LC, Third Place- Bay Area Global Outreach LC; Service, First Place - Bay Area Global Outreach LC, Second Place-Peninsula Special Interest LC, Third Place- San Bruno LC, Loudest Roar (Largest Club), First Place- San Mateo Metropolitan LC, Second Place-Silicon Valley Global Innovation LC, Third Place - San Carlos City LC; LCIF, San Mateo Metropolitan LC was acknowledged for recently donating \$15,000 to LCIF but it was not yet reflected in the LCIF database. Certificates of Appreciations were given to the clubs that are participating with our Club Improvement and Club Excellence Program such as the SF Aeta, SF Buddha, SF Marina North Beach, SF Bay Area, SF Bay Area New Century, SF Nikkei, SF Circle, SF Veterans, Silicon Valley LC, and Redwood City Downtown LC. Guiding Lions of each club were also recognized. The Club Improvement and Club Excellence also known as the LCI's Club Rebuilding Program addresses the back door drops in membership.

Our district's Lions Clubs service reporting is 91%. Our district donated \$48,104. Environmental Grant Program

Beginning April 1, 2022, "Earth Day," and through June 30, 2022, California Lions Clubs are encouraged to submit "Environment" grant requests to the California Lions Foundation (CLF) where grant monies are used to improve our California local community environment. Our MD4 Global Service Team is partnering with CLF in promotion of this Environment Grant Program.

A total of \$60,000 has been allocated by the California Lions Foundation for the environment themed program. Up to \$4000 is available per MD4 District for grants approved in the April through May 2022 timeframe. Any funds not allocated during the April-May timeframe will be reallocated into a statewide pool of grant monies available to any California Lions Club.

The CLF Environment Grant includes the following general requirements which are further specified in the application:

- 1. Grants are limited from \$500 to \$1000 per club
- 2. Grant applications must include a full description of the project and details of the expected cost
- 3. Grant applications must show how Lions are directly involved in hands-on execution of the project and management of the grant use-of-funds
- 4. If applying club still has an open grant, it must be closed prior to submission
- 5. Grant applications must include District Governor and District CLF Board Member, and Club President review and signature approval



Hello 4-C4 Lions!

This has been a busy year for LCIF granting over \$33 million dollars last year and close to that this year.

Campaign 100 has been very successful but still has a ways to go before the end

of the Lions year.

As of March 11, total raised is \$261,611,922. The goal is \$300 million. Almost there.

I cannot stress enough the power and impact from those donations. 100% of your donation is making a difference. The LCIF web site has many great stories of how donations are spent and I strongly urge you to take a look and learn more about our Foundation.

Did you know that any club donating at least \$5000 in one year will receive a "kick back" in the form of a District and Club Community Impact Grant? We have three clubs that just got notice of their return amounts based on last years donations. The District will also receive options based on the overall donations of our District. It's a great program. Even if you have a small project in mind you can contact our DG Dr. Jun and see if you can apply for some of that funding.

There is a new fund to donate to that is just for Refugees and Displaced persons. Over \$100,000 went out to assist Ukraine the first week. Much more since.

As a District we have donated almost \$50K for the year. Thank you so much to those of you that consistently donate and support. I know we can do more.



The Lions Eye Foundation & 2021 Year Review...



The Lions Eye Foundation and Its Mission

The Lions Eye Foundation of California-Nevada, Inc. (LEF) preserves and restores the gift of sight by providing free ophthalmic examinations, operations,

and medications to the less fortunate members of our community. LEF is comprised of member clubs from nine districts in Northern California and Nevada: Districts 46, 4-A1, 4-A2, 4-A3, 4-C1, 4-C2, 4-C3, 4-C4 and 4-C6. LEF in partnership with the Sutter California Pacific Medical Center (CPMC) Ophthalmology Department Residency Program provides all medical services free of charge to those less fortunate members in our communities.

The Lions Eye Clinic

Since April 2017, Lions patients are seen at a new state of the art Eye Clinic located at 711 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, California. The new clinic is made possible by the generosity of Sutter CPMC agreeing to finance the development of the clinic. From its capital fund raising campaign, LEF contributed \$340,000 in new equipment and \$140,000 toward an education center used by the residency program and LEF.

The 2021 Calendar Year Eye Care Services Provided

LEF and Lions' patients received \$9,949,413 in medical benefits during 2021. LEF spent \$631,911 for those benefits. LEF received \$15.74 in medical benefits for every dollar spent. This is a significant return for every dollar invested by LEF.



Many patients arrive with severe eye problems caused by financial constraints and limited access to eye care.
