DISTRICT GOVERNOR MESSAGE Lion Augusto "Jun" Valera, Jr., MD The Lionistic Year 2021-2022 is coming to an end. As of 06/15/2022, District 4-C4 is net

positive +343 in membership growth, making district 4-C4 the number one in membership growth and new

club development in North America (CA 1 & 2) .We were in this situation during LY 2015-2016 (DG Macy Mak Chan +195) and 2017-2018 ( DG Rod Mercado +379). To complete our district 4-C4 metrics. District 4-C4 chartered four new specialty clubs, three of which are organized by LIon Cindy Zheng namely Silicon Valley Global Innovations LC, SF Health Care Cyber LC and SF Global Art Cyber LC. The fourth specialty club was organized by Lions Rodger and Yollie Cayabyab. A Club Branch of SF Fil-Am LC, the SF VA Healthcare Professionals was organized by yours truly. Other historical achievements during LY 2021-2022 include attaining 100% club service reporting ( making our district from rank sixth to the first in MD4). We also attained 100% club donating to LCIF. We added one model club, the Bay Area Special Olympics LC. San Mateo Metropolitan LC attained 100/100 club two consecutive years!

Innovations we have introduced such as the WWW123 Project in service reporting were replicated by other districts. We opened the Lions College, an on-line training/learning for officers training series, member orientation, club orientation, etc as part of our leadership development with the initiative of Leo Lion August, Marketing Chair and Information Technology Chair, and PDG Mario Benavente as the Founding Dea. The Founding Governor Team of this Lions College are DG Dr. Jun Valera, IPDG Fanny Chu, 1VDG John Hui and 2VDG Kevin Guess. Our district GMA success story will be presented to the LCI International Convention in Montreal by DG Dr. Jun. He will also present another presentation entitled "Serving Safely During Covid-19 Pandemic".

I was able to apply for a GAT grant of \$500 which was used to buy 52 bike helmets which were donated to the veterans through the bikes4vets program of the SF Veterans LC. I was also able to secure a \$3,000 Environmental Grant from the California Lions Foundation which were used to buy trash pickers, pails, gloves, vests, rakes, brooms, garbage bags, and sanitizers for beach clean up and other environmental projects which are recurring projects intended to give opportunities for the clubs to serve their communities. The First Kevin Kielty Beach Clean Up was done in Ocean Beach last 06/12/2022. GST Coordinator chairs the environmental projects which are in honor of Lion Kevin Kielty, District Environmental Chair who passed away a few months ago.



Our District Convention in Redding, CA last May 19-22, 2022 was a great suc-

cess. PDG Lydia Taylor-Bellinger was the District Convention Chair. The theme of the district convention was "Multi-culture,

United in Service", in which we celebrated our different cultures and diversity through service". Our International guests, ID Deb and ID Spouse Ron Weaverling of Kansas enjoyed and said in verbatim "Best ever District Convention experience". DG James Varghese of 4-C3, 1VDG Mandy Daniels of 4-C1, and 2VDG Manil Shrestha and PIS Ambika were our visiting dignitaries from other districts.

Lion Clayton Jolly of Half Moon Bay LC won the 2VDG election against Lion Eleanor Britter of Peninsula Special Interest LC. 1VDG John Huie elected as DGE while 2VDG Kevin Guess elected as 1VDG. All ballot measures were approved.







# **PSILC & GIHW Updates**



Peninsula Special Interest Lions Club reached several of their goals for the year.

• We amassed 4 million pounds of food for several pantries in our

community. Yes, we have receipts for each delivery made and the approximate number of people served.

- Picked up and delivered to LIS 287,000 pairs of used Zenni glasses. Yes, we have receipts for pickup and delivery.
- Gave \$60,000 of Zenni certificates to clubs in our District and other California Districts. Yes, we have receipts.
- Gave \$30,000 of Zenni certificates to the International Lions Clubs who have endorsed the Global Initiative for Health and Wellness. Yes, we have receipts.
- Rerouted 365,000 pairs of Zenni used glasses to other Clubs in our District, other California Districts and the International Lions Clubs who have endorsed the GIHW. Yes, we have receipts.
- Our San Mateo, GIHW free clinic, gave 12,000 flu and COVID shots as well as administered to 3,000 additional patients. Yes, we have records.
- Found homes for 22 families that were homeless living in their cars during the pandemic. In addition, as they were living in their cars, we fed them hot meals with the help of Samaritan House. We delivered 19,000 meals during that time to families of 4 living in 22 cars. Yes, we have receipts.
- We raised a very large donation from Howse Services out of Texas to create and distribute to all children a Health & Wellness Curriculum via an Ed-tech on line solution on Chromebooks. The curriculum will also be in the SMFC summer school and during the next school year and more to come.
- The GIHW has delivered medical supplies and food during this year to the following.
  - To Tonga, though our Tongan member Lion Loisi Tuiono. Yes, we have receipts.
  - To Tonga, through the Foster City Bair Island Cyber Lions Club, we filled up a large con-

- tainer of medical supplies. To date, we have not received a receipt.
- To Ukraine, through Foster City \$550.00 donation from PSILC on be half of GIHW.
   Yes, we have receipts.
- To Ukraine, we sent 6 of our clinic doctors with medical supplies. They have been there for 2 months. Lions from Germany, Poland, Czech Republic and Latvia have also collected medical supplies that they drop off in Krakow and our doctors drive the trucks filled with supplies to the border of Ukraine and Poland to administer to those who are crossing the border
- To Philippines; we supplied over \$40,000 of medical and eye supplies to three California Districts, including 4C4, to support missions to the Philippines.
- To Mexico, Africa, India, Nepal & England we provided medical and vision supplies, thru 4C3, 4C4, 4L4, LIS and International Clubs who endorse GIHW.
- Our Club gave out 4 Melvin Jones awards. Donated generously to LCIF. Yes, we have receipts.
- Plastics; we donate 4 large boxes (100 pounds) of plastic to Millbrae Lion Club.

A note from secretary Eleanor Britter: Yes, we lost the election to a very worthy opponent. However, all was not lost, we had a visitor to our Host Room who offered us yet another large donation for our projects and his participation.

Thank you to all the clubs, we have had the honor and pleasure of working with this year.



**Ethics** 

TO SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

TO SEEK success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but TO TAKE an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customer and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my positions or actions towards my fellow man, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not as a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

TO AID my fellow men by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak and my substance to the needy.
