
LIONS RECYCLE FOR SIGHT

On September 16th, Lions Wing Yu and Shikha Bakshi Hamilton presented San Mateo High School with a check for \$3,000 from the Kris Bakshi Education Fund.

The Kris Bakshi Education Fund of the Foster City Lions Club presented a check for \$3,000 to San Mateo High School to assist students with college applications, essays, etc.

For the past two years, we sent 70 students through an SAT prep course at no cost to the students.

Because of Covid-19, we learned from the school that students need help with college essays/apps more than SAT prep as most CA schools have moved away from SATs.

The money will specifically go towards assisting those students in the AVID program.

We also donated \$1,500 to the Foster City Lions Club college scholarship fund.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) has provided educators nationwide a proven solution for systematically increasing academic rigor and creating engaging learning environments, accelerating the performance of underrepresented students and delivering results schoolwide.


