During 2021 we have recognized how the Sunday Farmers Market did not miss a Sunday due to COVID-19 coronavirus and we operated under COVID-19 rules and honored all those who made it possible. Our major fundraiser is the Sunday Farmers Market and we are able during our Fiscal Years to keep our Community Giving at a strong level thanks to all your efforts.

The vision screening is anticipated to happen in the first half of March 2022. Committee member Karen Maynor is assisting Mary Ellen to schedule other opportunities for SPOT vision screenings of young children and students later in the second half of Fiscal 2022.
