Menlo Park Live Oak Lions Club Celebration of 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Sunday Farmers Market At our March Club Board meeting after discussion it was decided that June 12, 2022 would be the Sunday for our Club to celebrate our 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Sunday Farmers Market. Tina Morris, Club President has been looking into a cloth shopping bag with our Club name and indicating we have achieved 30 years of community service as a Sunday Lions Farmers Market. The budget is being finalized to have a minimum of 500 shopper bags with handles to give away free of charge as a thank you to the shoppers for patronizing and supporting this community activity.

Other activities are being considered and some special award recognitions that will be in order for sustained support by our Lions volunteers, farmers, vendors and Friends of the Lions who help out on Sundays with some having been involved for all 30 years. A City of Menlo Park Proclamation is anticipated and several special guests will be invited to help out with our celebration.

There were lots of seminars to attend on all aspects of Lions activity and service to our communities. Jim Bigelow attended representing our Club and District 4-C4 was well represented. During the Convention LCI President Alexander held a question and answer session where any Lion member could as questions or provide input to our International President.

A major point made by IP Alexander during this open session was his importance of Lion members being seen in the community and providing meaningful help directly to people in need. To him that is what Lions are all about community service. Just giving cash donations where Lions are not visible in helping the community was a lesser priority but fundraising can also be worthwhile.

As you are aware our Lions sponsored Sunday Farmers Market in downtown Menlo Park as a fundraiser, generates donated produce for the needy and directly allows the community a great source of fruits and vegetables and other items. Our ICARE Committee began doing the SPOT vision screening in children centers and schools is another example of hands on contact of Lions in the community.

Our Club was nominated by PDG Fanny Chu for an MD4 Academy Award, for the large Club category and we were honored to be listed in the banquet program but another Lions Club won that honor. The Kay & Denise Fukushima Couple of the Year was awarded to District 4-C4 Debbie and Kevin Kielty of the Burlingame Lions Club. Both were not only active in their own Club but District wide activities and beyond and big supporters of The Peninsula Council.

I was sitting at a table while the Academy Awards were being presented with other District 4-C4 members and one of our Lions members called the Kielty's and informed them of being awarded Couple of the Year in Lions of California. I remember seeing a cell phone picture of Kevin in bed with a big smile! Kevin has been fighting a battle with cancer and he passed March 14<sup>th</sup>. It was really great that he was alive to see this recognition. I have known Kevin and Debbie for many years they are the best and Lion Kevin will really be missed!

<u>District Eyeglass Collection on March 19<sup>th</sup></u> John Hickson, Tina Morris and Ruthie Wilkins have been collecting and sorting eyeglasses and Saturday, March 19<sup>th</sup> was the day for all Clubs to turn in the eyeglasses. Tina Morris and Ruthie Wilkins turned in our Club eyeglasses and the weight was 152 pounds that equals over 2,000 pairs of glasses. Now we

<u>Club Farmers Market Report Update</u> The results of our Lions Sunday Farmers Market so far this Fiscal year from July 1, 2021 through last Sunday, March 20<sup>th</sup> are 26,525 pounds of donated produce collected from our farmers and provided to needy non-profits and gross income from vendor booth spaces is \$34,390.00. Our revenue is within \$1,000 of last year of this time and due to weather affecting our farmers we are running behind about 10,000 pounds of donated produce but spring is coming and farmers are planting so we hope to see increased donations of produce between now and June 30<sup>th</sup> as our Fiscal year comes to an end. We appreciate all the volunteer help each Sunday and the efforts of our yendors!
