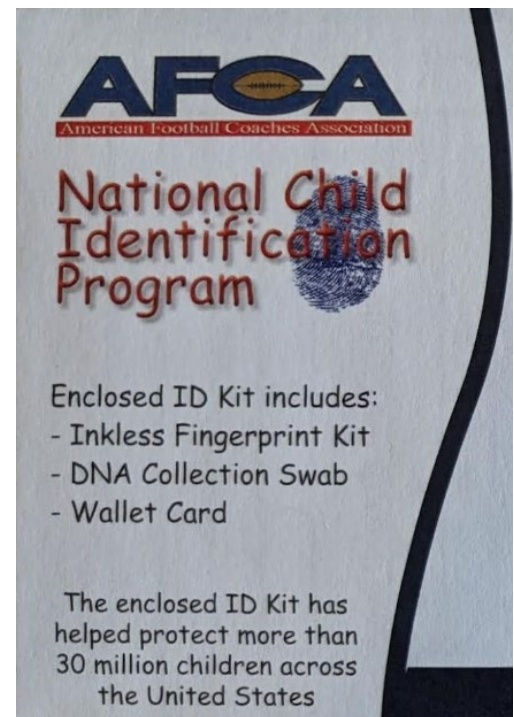
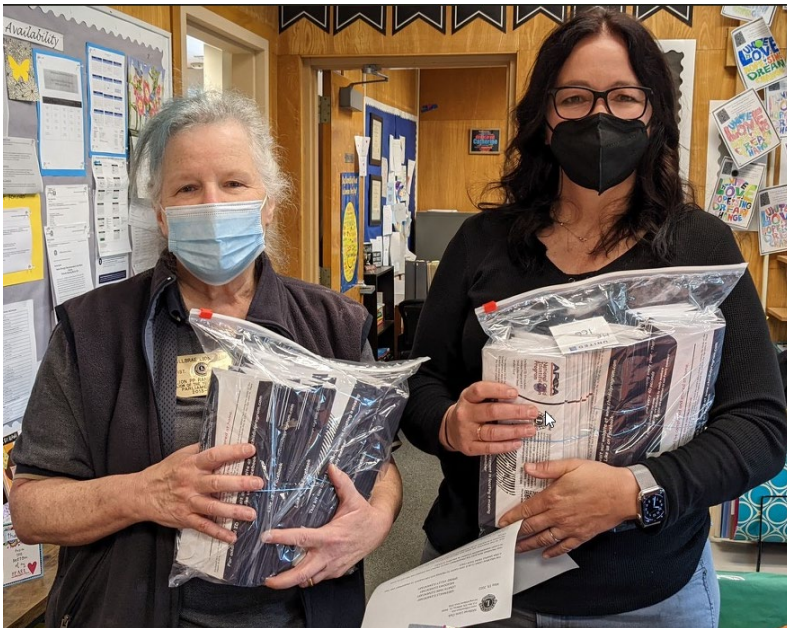

How to take prints
1. Open the kit pouch until ready to fingerprint.
2. Open the kit pouch. It contains a strip coated with a clear plastic fingerprint solution (AFCA-1000).
3. Take out the strip. Place the strip on a clean, flat surface.
4. Place the card and punch with strip on a flat surface.
5. Lightly and quickly touch your child's finger on the strip coated with the fingerprint solution.
6. Gently press the strip into the appropriate box.
7. Wait until the strip is dry.
8. Seal the strip once you are finished.

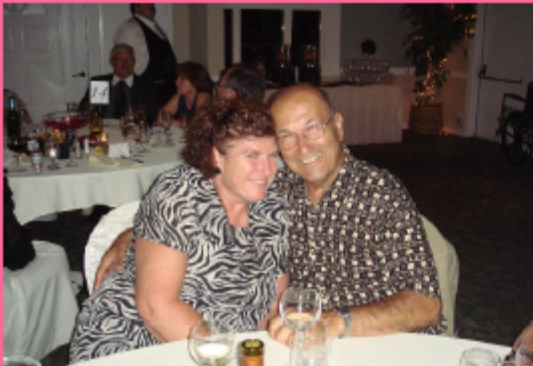


MILLBRAE LIONS CLUB Sunshine Report
