USO/SFO Supplies

With the Thanksgiving and Christmas Holidays, considerable travel occurred by our servicemen and women. Over 1600 troops and family members went through the USO/SFO and the same numbers will be going through in the new year when they return. As a result our Lions support was critical; supplies ran out in early January and we delivered another load on January 11; this was paid for by a specific donation by San Bruno Lion Smitty in memory of Lion Isaac Mejia. We will continue to deliver supplies every two months, thanks to donations by you Lions; in the last two months thanks Daily City Host, San Bruno, and San Carlos—your checks are very welcomed, by donations the rest of the year by so many other Lions.

New Development, Support by USO/SFO

USO/SFO has reciprocated; during the last two months, they have collected from the airlines 3 large boxes of personal care supplies, all those items given away by the airlines to passengers. Lions Teri Garcia and Verdie Thompson and their helpers will be boxing them and sending to our troops overseas.

Next, the USO has offered us to abandoned good clothes at SFO; these are clothing passengers have

left at the airport and has been designated for homeless veterans; any Lion or affiliate organization are able to distribute this clothing as needed. Contact us and we will arrange the transfer.

USO/Travis

Due to distance to Travis and temporary closure of the USO there, we have not continued to support the reopening of that USO; however, we have referred that opportunity to the Lions in that district's 1st VDG and it looks very promising; we have offered to help set up a Lions Veterans Charities, Inc. in that District as well as a start up donation by us in 4C4.

Year 2013

We are now planning for activities for the coming year; the Trustees have met and the district volunteers will be discussing activities next month. We will assist any club that wants to start veterans projects on their own.

Peninsula Veterans Lions Club Service Project—Kitchen Move In Kits

Kitchen kits are for the homeless Veterans who are moving into HUD-VASH (Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing). This program provides permanent housing for eligible single homeless Veterans and Veterans with families and is partnered with the Government HUD Housing Agency.

The kitchen kits are composed of dishes, cups and silverware for 2 persons. Also included in the kits are pans and cooking utensils, kitchen and apartment cleaning supplies (dishwashing soap, cleansers, sponges, mops and brooms). The majority of veterans do not have the money to initially purchase these essential items when they move into their apartments. The purpose of the kitchen kits are to help Veterans re-establish basic living skills.

The kits enable the Veteran to prepare a simple meal and develop healthier eating habits thus are less likely to eat out of fast food containers. A setting for two promotes socialization skills and adds to a more homelike environment. The cleaning supplies assist the Veterans in maintaining a clean house thus promoting and healthy living environment.
