



Did you know?

- Identity Theft is one of the fastest growing crimes.
- Last year, it was reported that 9.9 million people were victims of Identity Theft.
- The Federal Trade Commission estimates that every year over 700,000 US citizens are sufferers of identity theft and the average loss per victim is about \$20,000. It can take up to two years for victims to mend their damaged credit history
- ID Fraud from simple theft and use of someone's credit card to the stealing of a person's identity has costs businesses \$48 billion and its victims \$5 billion in the past year.
- Some victims of identity theft have been forced to legally change their names, while others have spent years trying to untangle their credit.

Don't Become a Victim of Identity Theft

Identity theft occurs when someone co-ops your name, Social Security number, credit card number, or some other piece of your personal information for their own use. In short, identity theft occurs when someone appropriates your personal information without your knowledge, to commit fraud or theft.
